

Providence

The holy, powerful and guiding force of wisdom from above secures and governs creation for the end to which the Creator intended. God's preservation allows all things to continue to exist within established laws that He preset from the foundation of the worlds. God spoke all things into existence and sustains them by the word of His power (Gen 1; Heb 1:1-5; Col 1:17). As the Creator with perfect knowledge, wisdom, goodness, justice and righteousness He is capable of measuring all things and to do all which are not essentially contradictory to His being. He is able to discern the best and preinclined execution of His scheme where it becomes natural and proper in all spheres. God is not a disinterested party in the activities of the world. Supernatural miracles have been worked by God and have a unique function. Miracles and providence are not the same. Providence is the Creator maintaining the balance of all worlds (natural and spiritual). By providence God fulfills His divine purposes in the regulations of all affairs with a special emphasis on those who seek to do His will (Rom 8:26-30).

Providence is comprehended by considering that God is operating "behind the scenes". Miracles are physical, while providence is not a demonstration by physical means. One only knows that the Creator is providentially at work because the scriptures tell us of His actions. Providence is dissimilar to miracles because in it God maneuvers within His own laws to accomplish His definitive purposes. The free will of man is never overridden. God always allows man to have the freedom of choice; nevertheless the Bible clearly states that God is active in the affairs of all creation.

The Godhead (Father, Son and Holy Spirit [Ghost]) is the cause of the universe (Gen 1; Jn 1:1, 2; Heb 1:1-3; Col 1:17) and these divine personalities continue to control and sustain nature. They are controlling and unifying all forces (spiritual and natural).

The seasons (Eccl 3; Gen 1; 8:22), the entirety of earthly endowments (Jas 1:17,

18), bounties of all descriptions (Acts 14:16) are under the providential control of God. Creatures large and small are all under His management (Matt 10:29). The Bible abounds with examples of God using creatures and natural forces to prevail under the auspices of providence i.e. Abraham and a ram (Gen 22:13), prophet killed by lion (1 Kg 13:2426), prophet fed by raven (1 Kg 17:1-7), boys killed by a bear (2 Kg 2:22-25).

God was active in the affairs of the world to put into action a plan for the redemption of fallen man, from the foundation of the world (Eph 1:3-13). This plan was to make salvation available for all mankind (Gal 3:23-29). Even among the nations God prepared that a Saviour would eventually rule over them (Ps 22:28; Dan 2). God rules the affairs of men (Rom 13; Acts 17:26, 27). In particular God was in the national affairs of the Hebrews (Israelites) and from them came the appointed Messiah, Jesus Christ of Nazareth. The Messianic seed line was preserved in spite of the unfaithfulness of most of Israel.

No one can look at the story of Joseph in the Bible and doubt God's involvement (not miraculously) behind the scenes to preserve a seed line. Joseph's youth, young manhood and eventually becoming second only to Pharaoh was important. However of greater importance was the saving of his family (the seed line).

The Messianic prophecies were extended over millenniums (thousands of years) and each came to pass. God has shown His special operations in the affairs of those who earnestly seek the truth and definitely the Christians. Seekers find, askers receive, knockers have it opened (Mat 7:7-12) as God works behind the scenes.

Paul is a vivid demonstration of providence at work. Paul was to go to kings and gentiles and to suffer for Christ's sake. Paul desired to preach in Rome (Rom 1:9, 10). Paul returned to Jerusalem and was arrested (Acts 21), told to be of good cheer that he would not die in Jerusalem (Acts 23), was saved from the mob (Acts 23), imprisoned 2 years (Acts 24), appealed to Caesar (Acts 25), ship wrecked on the way to Rome (Acts 27) and arrived in Rome to preach (Acts 28). His prayers and those of the Romans were answered through the mysterious workings of providence. The people of God need to rejoice in the confidence that the Lord God is ever near and operates through providence as an abiding presence in daily lives.

This is very sad but true. The most frightening thing that we have to contend with everyday, is in our society many people who believe there are many roads leading to salvation. They will argue, "What makes you think your way is right? My way is just as good as your way." With thousands of different so called religions claiming to have the truth with different views on the subject of salvation and being Christ like. What do the scriptures say and how many ways are mentioned?

The Lord said the gate is small, the way is narrow, and there are few people who will find it (Matt. 7:14). Now, for us to get there we must enter by the narrow door, which means we must live as Jesus gave us the example to live, in order to obtain eternal life. Anyone who climbs up some other way is like a thief and a robber (John 10:1). Jesus plainly tells us that He is the door (John 10:9).

In the Scriptures (God's Word) there is only one body, one Spirit, one Lord, one faith. one baptism, one God and Father of all (Eph. 4:4-6). From what we have just referenced we can see there is only one way to the Father and his Kingdom and thus to receive eternal life (John 14:6). We must remember, it is impossible for God to lie and no lie is of the truth (Heb. 6:18; 1 John 2:21).

We are going to be judged by the words in the Bible and by their works (Rev. 20:12). If we live a life of righteousness and good works our names will be recorded in the book of life (Luke 10:20). Those that live their life according to the scriptures will be resurrected to eternal life (John 5:28-29; Matt. 5:16).

If we are not gathered with saints when we are physically able we ought to re-thank our position. The whole congregation is not complete without everyone present that could be. Hope to see you soon gathered with the saints that miss you very much!
