

Immortality

The survival of the soul [the spiritual part of man] after death is contemplated in endless life or existence. Death is not the finality of a human. The soul survives and lives in a realm of departed spirits. It is commonly known as the "hereafter". It is the location of the immaterial being that has been changed to live in that state. The resemblance of the immortal to the mortal is unique. Immortals need nothing of this present world. Life as it is lived will pass. Death when one is in the Lord is not a joyless, feeble, shadowy realm from which to shrink back or an inert state of death. Therein is promised eternal life (1 Cor 15:50-58). Immortality is a noble hope. The "mortal coil" or outer being is shuffled off and replaced with the being fitted for eternity. imperishableness of the inward being is inherently indestructible.

The soul survives the body in a disembodied state wherein those who sought redemption while in the physical world find comfort and solace in the spiritual world. Those who detested the salvation offered and refused it find the realm of the departed soul led to "gehenna" [torment]. Hence, immortality is not merely survival in a state of disembodiment. It is not simply passing into "Sheol or Hades". The grave is not the final resort for the soul. Deliverance from death in a prolonged state in a spiritual world as promised was made for man's soul. It is called "eternal life". The two destinies of souls are established while upon the earth.

"If a man die, shall he live again?" is one of the most common questions of all times. The Old Testament sets forth the concept that there is a recourse to evil by presenting punishment to enforce obedience. Moses spoke of the "tree of life" giving as an insight into life beyond this life. God is called the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, thus portraying them as living and God being the God of the living (Ex 3:6; Mat 22:32). The implication is that there is a continuance after death (immortality). The idea of a soul/spirit indicates there must be a spiritual realm. Proof of life after death is a person being raised from the dead (1 Kg 17:17-24; 2 Kg 4:17-35).

Immortality is because of a relationship with God (Gen 1:27). Mankind is more than a mere

animal. Life will transcend mortality. There is inherently a promise of immortality if man is obedient to God. Mankind is composed of body and soul/spirit. Both are integral parts of the person. Mankind was created for everlasting life, not for mortality (1 Pet 2:11, 12). The pledge of God was that the immortality promised would be demonstrated (Enoch- Gen 3:22; Elijah- 2 Kg 2:11, 12; Psm 49:15; 73:24).

Sin and death frustrate the original destiny of man [fellowship with God]. Sin brings about spiritual death [separation from God]. Death, as a physical aspect, separates the body and soul, breaking the unity of man's characteristics. In one sense sin is the destruction of fellowship with God for which mankind was originally predestined (Eph 1:3-14). This does not imply the extinction of the inner man (2 Cor 4:16-18). The inner man survives. The scheme of redemption is grace and mercy restoring mankind to God. The bright hope of an obedient believer is eternal life with God.

The grace of God offers a ransom and delivers mankind (Rom 5:1-11; Eph 1:3-15). God's grace and mercy enter into the hopelessness of man's lost state offering reconciliation (2 Cor 5:18-20). God allows mankind to enter into a covenant of fellowship (2 Cor 6:14-7:1). In this fellowship the soul is lifted again to the true hope of immortality. This promise placed in the forefront of God's favor is wholesome and true (Psm 4:6; 16:2). The hope of the obedient is a principle of deliverance and redemption. Favor that the redeemed have with God is not lost in death.

In full harmony with what has been revealed by God there is hope of immortality discovered in the New Testament (1 Cor 15:50-58). This joyful schooling is found in every part of the apostolic teachings (1 Pet 1:3-11). Jesus brought life and immorality to light through the gospel (2 Tim 1:10). By patience and well-doing the obedient follower of Christ is granted glory, honor, incorruption and eternal life (Rom 2:7). This immortality is bestowed by Christ upon believers and is guaranteed by His own resurrection and life in glory (Rom 1:1-5).

The future state of the Christian is "though he die, yet shall he live; and whosoever believeth on me shall never die" (Jn 11:25-29). Jesus went to prepare a place for the redeemed (Jn 14:1-5). He told the thief on the cross that he would be in paradise that day (Lk 23:43). The survival of the righteous and unrighteous is seen in the teachings of the rich man and Lazarus (Lk16:19-31).

The future is filled with joy and peace for the faithful and woe and sorrow for the unfaithful. We choose our destiny while we are upon the earth. Choose well!

Before The Father

"Wherefore even the first covenant hath not been dedicated without blood. For when every commandment had been spoken by Moses unto all the people according to the law, he took the blood of the calves and the goats, with water and scarlet wool and hyssop, and sprinkled both the book itself and all the people, saying, this is the blood of the covenant which God commanded to you-ward. Moreover the tabernacle and all the vessels of the ministry he sprinkled in like manner with the blood. And according to the law, I may almost say, all things are cleansed with blood, and apart from shedding of blood there is no remission. It was necessary therefore that the copies of the things in the heavens should be cleansed with these; but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these. For Christ entered not into a holy place made with hands, like in pattern to the true; but into heaven itself, now to appear before the face of God for us: nor yet that he should offer himself often, as the high priest entereth into the holy place year by year with blood not his own; else must he often have suffered since the foundation of the world: but now once at the end of the ages hath he been manifested to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself. And inasmuch as it is appointed unto men once to die, and after this cometh judgment; so Christ also, having been once offered to bear the sins of many, shall appear a second time, apart from sin, to them that wait for him, unto salvation" (Heb 9:18-28).

The redemption of mankind by the blood of Jesus is portrayed as the inauguration of the New Testament. It is compared to the Old Testament. Moses commanded the people to do all according to the law. Animal sacrifices were similar to the blood of Jesus. Aspects of setting apart the book of the law by means of blood proved it was to be held in the highest regard. The children of Israel were to keep themselves purified and consecrated to God. God imposed with authority and emphasis that this solemn arrangement was given as an agreement with Israel.

Without the shedding of blood there is no remission. Every sin requires atonement and no atonement can be made without the shedding of blood. The blood of animals was set forth in the Old Testament, but the shedding of Jesus' blood on the cross was a better sacrifice. The Old Testament was a **typical** of the **antitype** of Jesus' redeeming mankind. Jesus presented Himself as the "lamb of God" which took away sins of the world (Jn 1:29, 36). Atonement was the expiation or canceling by propitiation. It reconciles man to God. Jesus is mankind's propitiation (Rom 3:21-30; 1 Jn 2:1-5).

Now at the end of the ages Jesus is manifested to take away sins. It is appointed that man must die and appear before judgment. All the former sacrifices could not avail to remove the stain of sin. Jesus' blood was the soul cleansing and redemptive. The sinner has nothing to offer for his soul's redemption. The inestimable sacrifice of Jesus Christ compels a sinner seeking redemption to humbly submit to the demands of the New Testament. It is implicitly important, as a matter of faith, that all understand the avenue of salvation was opened by Jesus' death and His presentation of His blood before the Father. Consequently the restoring of fellowship with God came by Jesus Christ (2 Cor 6:14-7:1). Christ is coming again (1 Thes 4:13-18). Urgently mankind needs redemption through His blood.
