

God Answers

God answers every important question we face. Affirming, emphasizing and explaining the all sufficiency of the Bible, sacred Scripture is found by using time and talents. Practicality for the Bible is crucial to application for daily living. Biblical writers glorified God and praised the Godhead for full revelation of salvation's plan [scheme of redemption]. Each book of the Bible makes a vital contribution to our understanding. The Bible was planned to give us a historical overview in words, phrases, paragraphs, chapters and books. Knowledge of the whole Bible is essential. It is good to read the Bible entirely one book at a time. Connect one section to another one will fully see what wonders God has achieved. Therein we see the parts are interconnected a whole.

Human redemption is a fact. Genesis one, two and three were specifically designed to explain the need for redemption. With all the advantages, circumstance, opportunities and blessings Adam and Eve transgressed God's will. Through one man "sin entered into the world and death through sin; so death passed unto all men, for all have sinned" (Rom 5:12). Hence, the world is where sin and death [spiritual and physical] exist. One dies physically as a consequence of Adam's sin. One dies spiritually because of personal sins As one reaches the age accountability and yields to temptation and trespasses God's law he or she is thereafter a sinner until redeemed by the Savior's blood (Rom 5:1-11).

All accountable persons are in need of redemption. Anterior to the New Testament dispensation Gentiles violated that which God gave them to do (Moral laws Rom 1:18-32; 2:1-16) and were without excuse and condemned. Hebrews (Jews) violated Moses' law and were condemned (Rom 1:1-3, 20). Jew and Gentile alike were sinners, guilty and condemned (Rom 3:22, 23; 6:23). No accountable person can say, "I don't have sin" unless they are deceived and the truth is not in them (1 Jn 1:5-10).

The Bible demonstrates redemption thought Christ (Rom 3:24; 1 Jn 2:1-5). Through the propitiatory sacrifice of Christ, he who is obediently faithful is by God's own act delivered from justly deserved wrath and placed in a covenant relationship by grace (Eph 1:3-15; Col 1:14; Gal 1:4; 1 Pet 1:18-25). After the resurrection, Jesus interpreted the law, prophets and psalms that spoke of him. These Old Testament books emphasized man's need, Christ's suffering, death, resurrection and bringing salvation to both Gentiles and Jews (Gal 3:26-29; Lk 24:44-46; Jn 5:37-39, 46; Acts 3:18; I Pet 1:10-12). Christ is the sum of all Old Testament teachings concerning redemption.

The Bible relates that man's hope of salvation is not within found himself. The need for a Savior defines that God does not need to be reconciled to man: rather man must be reconciled to God. Enmity existed between man and God. God is immutable (Heb 6:11-13). God can act towards those who come to Him in obedience by offering a favorably removal of sin because of Jesus' propitiatory death on the cross. God's unchanging righteousness accepts this sin offering from Christ and reconciles man to himself (2 Cor 5:18-20). The expiatory act of Christ upon the cross means the barrier interposed by sin between man and God has been removed. Christ's sinless life and sacrifice annuls the power of sin to separate God and faithful obedient believers (Rom 6:1-11).

Christ is set forth in the Old Testament in subtle statements where typical is used as an essential and uniform way of presenting salvation. These types were models and patterns used as a method of doctrinal instructions. Unmistakably sacrifices in the Old Testament worship constituted a unique insight into Divine authority and acceptable worship by those offering prescribed items in accordance to patterns. Scriptures leave no room for contravening divine mandates. Worship and sacrifices were expressly recognized as a part of God's ordained plan. Without authorized acts of worship, the acts became something offered by human will, in ignorance or vainly which God would not accept. These visual tokens were preformed with divine seal of approval or rejected as flagrant violations (Mal 1:6-14). The New Testament worshiper uses the same high standards of offering spiritual sacrifices to God (Rom 12:1-5).

Our society still has much confusion about Baptism. The teachings about Baptism are very clear that are recorded in the Bible. The Bible mentions at least six Baptisms; (1) baptism of Israel (I Cor. 10:2), (2) baptism of John (MK. 1:4-5), (3) Christ's baptism of suffering (MK. 10:38-39), (4) baptism in the Holy Spirit (Matt. 3:11, Acts 2:1-4), (5) great commission baptism (Matt. 28:18-20), which is water baptism in the name of Jesus (Acts 2:38), and (6) baptism in fire (Matt. 3:11-13). But in Eph. 4:5, the Bible plainly declares that there is only One baptism. That is, there is now only one valid baptism in effect today that man can obey, and the others have ceased or are yet future.

The one baptism of Christianity is immersion, a burial (Rom. 6:4), in water (Acts 8:35), of the penitent (Acts 2:38), believing (Mk. 16:16), adult (Acts 8:12), for (in order to) the remission of sins (Acts 2:38). It identifies with or reenacts the death, burial and resurrection of Christ (Rom. 6:3-5). It is commanded by Christ (Acts 10:48), and is necessary for entrance into Christ's spiritual body -- the church (Gal. 3:27, I Cor. 12:12). Baptism is part of the new birth (John 3:3-5), prerequisite unto salvation from sins (Acts 22:16, 2:38, I Pet. 3:21), and prior to one's reception of the gift of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:38). It is a declaration of one's faith in God (Col. 2:11-12), and the point of beginning for one's new life in Christ (Rom. 6-3-6). Notice that new life comes after baptism, NOT before. It reaches or applies the blood of Christ (Rom. 6:4), and saves on the virtue or merits of Christ's blood (I Pet. 3:21). It gives one the scriptural right to wear the name Christian (Acts 28:26).

Immersion in water after one believes and repents causes a spiritual cleansing of one's soul by the power of the blood of Christ, not water, (Acts 22:16), I Pet. 3:21), and is an act of faith in response to the grace of God which justifies sinners (Co1.11-13, Tit. 2:5, Mk. 16:16). One who has received this baptism is saved by grace through faith, and those that have not received Bible baptism are still lost in their sins. We need to make sure we have been scripturally baptized. We need to forget what man has written and said about baptism and restudy anew what the Bible says about it.

Continued from right column... The Bible continues to be the best seller. In the Bible, we find the origin, reason for man and his destiny. It is the only textbook on salvation. There is no conflict between the Bible and science. There may be conflict with theories of some scientist and so-called "Bible scholars". The word "Bible" is commonly used for the Old and New Testaments this dates back to about 400 AD. It is derived from the Greek word for "book". The distinction of the Old and New Testament is seen in Hebrews 7. The Bible should be studied, taught and obeyed.

Facts About The Bible

The Bible was written over 1600 years of human history, spanned 60 generations, 40 writers from every walk of life including kings, peasants, fishermen, poets, statesmen, scholars, military generals, cupbearers, tax collectors, Rabbi, herdsman, political leaders. It was written in different places: wilderness, dungeon, while traveling, during rigors of military campaigns, palace and in peace. It has sorrow, joy, life, despair, death and hope in its pages. The languages were Hebrew, Aramaic, Greek and scattered words from other languages. It does not shy away from controversial subjects. It speaks to hundreds of subjects with incessant harmony from Genesis to Revelation. Like the human body can only be explained properly when referenced to as a whole, so also the Bible is explained only by the whole. No other book has been more influence on the Western world than the Bible. Its survival throughout the ages compared with other ancient writings is evidence of providence. The Bible has, unlike other books, had the most vicious attacks from burning it to outlawing it in the Roman Government, the modern Communism dominated countries and the Moslem world. This does not prove the Bible is true but that it stands alone among other books. Thousands of time the death knell for the Bible has been sounded, the funeral plans made, tombstones etched and committals pondered but somehow they never get the corpse to stay put. The Bible is loved by millions and studied by millions each day. It has caused a river of books to be written about it- Dictionaries, Encyclopedias, Lexicons, Atlases, Histories, commentaries, Language studies, Biographies, Devotional books, Christian Evidence, Apologetics and the list goes on. It was the first religious book to be taken and read in outer space. It is also the most expensive book sold- the Gutenberg Latin Vulgate was sold for thousands of dollars and the Codex Sinaiticus for even

The Bible contains over 3,566,480 letters, 773,746 words, 31,102 verses, 1,189 chapters and 66 books. The Old Testament contains 39 and the New Testament 27. The average word contains fewer than 5 letters. The word Jehovah occurs 6,855 times, Lord 1,853 times, reverend only once (Ps 111:9). Esther has 10 chapters and neither the word Lord nor God is found in it. The center chapter is also the shortest chapter (Ps 117). The middle verse is Ps 118:8. Job is the middle book of the Old Testament and 2 Thessalonians is the middle of the New Testament. The middle verse of the Old Testament is 2 Chronicles 20:13, the shortest is 1 Chronicles 1:25 and in the New Testament John 11:35 (in the Greek it is 1 Thessalonians 5:16). The middle of the New Testament is between Romans 13 and 14. The longest verse is Esther 8:9 with 90 words and the longest word found in the Bible in Isaiah 8:1 [Mahershalalhashbaz]. All the letter but J is found in Ezra 7:21. Psalm 119 was used to teach the Hebrew alphabet [22 letters]. 19 chapters of 2 Kings and 37 of Isaiah are nearly identical.

The Bible was the first book printed. It was translated from Hebrew to Greek in 270 BC. King James had the Bible published in 1611. The first Bible printed in America was in the Indian language (1663) by John Eliot. The first English Bible was printed in 1782. The first translation made in America was 1808 by Charles Thomson. Alexander Campbell published a "Living Oracles", a New Testament translation in 1826. Noah Webster translated the Bible in 1833. The Revised Version was in 1885. The American Standard was 1901. Hugo divided the Bible into chapters in 1250 AD. Robert Stephens divided the New Testament into chapters in 1551AD. The entire Bible appeared in chapter and verse in 1560AD in what was known as the "Geneva Bible" [also called the Breeches Bible in Genesis 3:7 used the word breeches for aprons]. The Bible is the most translated book in the world. All the languages and dialects are being used to translate the Bible allowing ethnic groups to read the word of the Lord.
