Glory Gilded Pages

Delighting in the Bible gives a genuine spiritual lift to the soul. Ignorance of the Scriptures among Americans underestimates how valuable they are to the nation. Curbing the trends towards immorality and weakening spiritual foundations can commence with taking time to study the Bible. History reveals a direct connection present-day between biblical literacy and civilization's ethical weakness. There is no article owned by so many families which finds so little use and yet it is declared to be the foundation for families. No book of constant truth is so distained and no literature found can equal it. Recent surveys among students found that the Bible is seldom read, characters mentioned in it are slightly known and yet it remains the world's best seller. Adults responding to a similar survey attest to ignorance of its content. Various societies circulate Bibles around the world. Annually millions of copies are given, but receiving and reading is not synonymous. Hotels and Motels have Bibles which have remained unopened for decades. The greatest master piece of literature reposes unopened. Modern writers use its phrases and lessons without giving credit to where the information came from, annulling the value of the Bible. Words like "a city set upon a hill, salt of the earth, apple of the eye, faith, hope and charity and at wit's end" are sited without the remotest idea where they originated. The Bible cannot give value to life if it remains a "curiosity" and not a book of principles and treasures of knowledge.

Sinners will hate the Bible. When in need they often turn to it and love it with the heart of a saint. The Bible denounces evil and lauds virtue. Its instruction advances value and holiness in mankind. Human sorrow has a "balm of Gilead" to sooth a wounded soul because of its pages. Where the Bible is used a civilization arises with the highest values. Bible centered people build hospitals and terrorist destroy them. The more this book is read the farther away from sin it leads. A child can learn its principles and grow to practice it precepts. The old can rest on its comforting promises and pass to the brighter world it predicts. The illiterate can be taught from its pages and the scholar admits that each day something new can be learned from it. It is loved by many who attend to the dying and wait upon the infirm, by those who do business in a community where reputation matters while affirming that families are the bedrock of society. The Bible is never out of date and meets all needs. It completely covers the human condition

in such a way that no one need to add or to subtract from it. It is a book compiled by men who were inspired but lived humble and lowly lives. It was written in an Oriental culture but gave life to the Occidental culture. It has survived the wrath of kings, rages of cultural changes, overwhelming obstacles wherein its believers were persecuted and killed. It has been hidden but could not remain hidden. Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, Coast Guard, Airmen read it and pray to the God it teaches them about. and comforts at funerals lauds accomplishments in the name of God. The Scriptures teachings are true inviting all who contest them to prove wherein they are wrong. It hides nothing, all is open for consideration. Historians know that which it teaches has never been successfully denied. Scientists know it is not a book on science but it is the epitome of truth. Archeologists pour over its pages to find lost clues and every investigator of any kind, if they are wise, esteems the Bible's teachings.

To gain from its valuable resources one must read it with a spiritual inclination. The natural man finds it foolishness, but God will destroy the wisdom of the world and bring it to naught (1 Cor 1:18-31). There is no end to books, doubtful disputations and seeking after personal aggrandizement, but God's book is not the wisdom of this world. It will last throughout the ages. Excellency of speech or man's wisdom does not determine the Bible's value. ... but as it is written, Things which eye saw not, and ear heard not. And which entered not into the heart of man, Whatsoever things God prepared for them that love him. But unto us God revealed them through the Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God. For who among men knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of the man, which is in him? even so the things of God none knoweth, save the Spirit of God... Which things also we speak, not in words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Spirit teacheth; combining spiritual things with spiritual words. Now the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him; and he cannot know them, because they are spiritually judged. But he that is spiritual judgeth all things, and he himself is judged of no man. For who hath known the mind of the Lord, that he should instruct him? But we have the mind of Christ" (1 Cor 2:6-16). Knowing the God's book is a must.

The Bible must be studied, considered, prayed about and applied. If our Bible study is to be spiritually beneficial we must reverence the **Author**. It yields its greatest resources when we neither add to it, nor take away from it and change nothing in it. The words in it are sacred and great care should be maintained not to disregard a single one of them. Within it are glory gilded pages from Heaven. God is love (1 Jn 3).
