Our God Made The Races

Adam and Eve were the first humans. They were unique. Adam was created when God took the dust of the earth forming and breathing into him the breath of life. Eve was taken from his side. Both had the image of God within them and both were created to have free moral agency. They could and did make choices. Eve sinned first by being beguiled and taking of the forbidden fruit (1 Tim 2:8-15). The man also sinned. Thus, sin entered into the world (Gen 3:1-8). What did mankind lose because of the fall of Adam and Eve? A comparison of things before and after the fall gives a hint about the things which did not change and those which did change.

The fall of mankind did not alter the fact that man is a living soul or being created in the image of God (Gen 2:7; 3:17-24; 1 Cor 15:35-49). Man still has the image of God within him (Gen 1:27; 1 Cor 11:7; Mat 19:4). Man remained conscious of God, himself, the world and others (Gen 3:7-10; Gal 6:1-10; 1 Jn 2:15-17). Man remained under the law of God (Gen 2:16-18; Rom 8:1-39; Jas 1:25, 2:12). Man remains a responsible being (Gen 2:15-17; 3:9-19; Eph 4 & 5 & 6). Man has faith in God (Gen 2:16; Jn 14:1-5; Rom 10:1-17; Heb 11:1-6). Man continues to communicate with God (Gen 2:16-18; Heb 4:14-16; Mat 6:9-15). Man has dominion over the world (Gen 2:15; Psm 8:6). Man still works (Gen 2:15; 2 Thes 3:10). Man and woman still marry (Gen 2:15-25; Eph 5:22-33; Heb 13:1-4). Man still seeks to have fellowship with others. Man still has a mind, heart and soul (Mat 22:34-40). Man can reason, ponder, and think (Phil 4:8, 9). Reasoning power can be perverted, but normally an individual can reason. In man is the image of God remains (2 Cor 4:16-18; 1 Cor 11:7; Jas 3:9; Act 17:28-31). Man is moral recognizing responsibility and duty (Phil 2:12-18). He has eternity within himself (Eccl 3:11). Man worships (Jn 4:23; Col 2:8-19). Man remains a free moral agent. Time does not erode man's nature. He can make moral choices which will affect his destiny (Josh 24:14, 15; Phil 1:12-30). Man can still be tempted (1 Cor 10:13; Jas 1:12-18). Adam and Eve sinned but their sin cannot be passed to their children (Ezek 18:19, 20). Man is not deprave but he can sin and fall short of the grace of God (Rom 3:23). The mind, heart and will were misused in the fall, but that does mean sin cannot overcome through obedient faith (1 Jn 5:1-5; Rom 8:31-39). Man is the object of God's concern before and after the fall. Sin's effect on mankind is deadly but grace is more than equal to the task of saving mankind from sin (Eph 2:1-11). Sin did not take away man's ability to hear and obey God (1 Sam 15:17-23; Rom 10:1-17; 16:26).

Man lost innocence because of Adam and Eve sinning. Man lost paradise but will regain it if faithful unto death (Lk 16:19-31; Lk 23:43; Rev 2:10). Sin separated man from God, but Jesus bridged the gap (Is 59:1, 2; 1 Tim 1:15). Man will work and woman will endure pain in child birth (Gen 3:6-8). Her husband will have authority over her (Gen 3:9-23; 1 Cor 11:1-16). Man and woman were cut off from the tree of life (Gen 3:22-27; Rev 22:1-5). Mankind was lost, guilty of sin, separated from God and needed a Saviour (1 Cor 1:18-31; Rom 5:1-11).

Man needs to turn back to God, be converted by doing all things contained in the New Covenant. Conversion implies that mankind can return to fellowship with God (2 Cor 6:14-7:1; 5:18-20; 1 Tim 1:12-17). Each individual who is of the age of accountability is responsible for their actions. When those actions are contrary to the will of God they are called sin. Hence, a disobedient person becomes sinful or a sinner. God was not willing that any should perish in sin (Lk 13:35; Jn 3:15, 16; 2 Pet 3:9). Sinful mankind can escape Satan by being converted (Col 1:13-18; Eph 2:1-11). We are servants of whom we obey (Jn 8:31-34; Rom 6:15, 16). Mankind must hear and heed the voice of God. Refusal of God leaves mankind in a state of sin and unable to save themselves. God's plan from the foundation of the world was to redeem mankind from sin by the blood of Jesus Christ (Eph 1:3-15; Col 1:9-24). God through His agents [teachers, preachers, and church of Christ] teach mankind what they must do to be saved from their lost situation. The book of Acts is filled with conversions of sinners (Acts 2: 8: 9; 10; 16). Independence from God must be changed into a dependence upon God. Ruined mankind must return to God to receive grace and mercy (Eph 2:1-23). Only the knowledge of God and obedience can effect redeem for mankind (2 Pet 3:14-18). Believing, repenting, confessing Jesus as the Christ and being baptized into Him for the remission of sins are the first principles of the oracles of God (Lk 13:3; Acts 2:38; 8:37, 38; Heb 5:11-14). The fall of an individual is a result of sin and each must be converted to the ways of God.

The truth of God exists to contradict error. Dehumanizing and animalizing mankind is when the truth of God is changed into a lie (Rom 1:25). The fundamental issue before mankind is facing the problem of sin and conquering it (Gen 4). If the Bible and Christianity are thrown away God will still be here, but mankind will not have the necessary tools to be converted, nor can they save themselves from sin. It is **paramount** that the church of Christ survives and flourishes. It is **incumbent** upon her to remain faithful and teach the truth, which sets mankind free from sin and death (Eph 3:1-13). Mankind lost a great deal in the fall. Christ restores mankind to God when they are obedient. The gift of God is eternal life in Christ (Rom 6:23).

"A CHRISTIAN'S GUIDE TO REFUTING MONDERN ATHEISM"

The <u>Apologetic Press</u> provides an indispensible service to our brotherhood. Their literature on Christian Evidences has spanned several decades. Writing books in defense of the Bible seeks to prove the inspiration of God's word. It is important that good reference materials be available for Christians to read and use. Compromising the word of God is a tool that is used repeatedly. There are those who are willing to negotiate away the heritage of the Bible.

Watering down and willingness to give into "evolutionary teachings" is commonplace and looms as one of the most pressing problems of our times. Some wish the church of Christ to be nothing more than "another denomination". The Church of Christ is not Jew, Catholic nor Protestant. Her heritage is a **Restoration of the Ancient Order.** Restoring first century Christianity comes about by using Bible words for Bible things and doing Bible things in Bile ways. Compromise comes in many forms. One serious compromise is over the **Genesis account**. **Theistic Evolution** is only atheistic without the "a". There is no more despicable compromise than theistic evolution. Having capitulated, these have little faith in what God said and great faith in what man says. Theistic and Atheistic evolution deny verbal plenary inspiration of the Bible. Compromise has no place where God's word is concerned.

Kyle Butt and Dan Baker engaged in a debate February 12, 2009. Kyle Butt is a member of the Apologetic Press staff. He is a graduate of Freed-Hardeman University. He has authored more than 20 books over the last decade. He is the editor of the Discovery magazine, a monthly periodical about Scripture and science for children third through sixth grades [we give these to our children, each month]. He debated **Dan Baker**, a former denominational minister who became an atheist in 1983. The debate was centered on the existence of God. This debate was on the campus of the University of South Carolina in Columbia. It was sponsored by the atheistic student organization known as the Pastafarian. It was a part of a Darwin Day event celebrating the 200th anniversary of Origin of the Species. Baker was "stunned" with the truth brother Butt presented. The time limits imposed upon the participants prevented brother Butt from presenting the total evidence on several points. Consequently, there are notes to the debate on DVD and in a new book, "A Christian's Guide To Refuting Modern Atheism". This book will provide the reader unique insights into the ways atheism can be soundly defeated on the subject "Is There A God?" It will be invaluable in light of the compromises and skepticism of our day. It is good that the atheist have a formidable individual that will debate the issue with such a commanding presence.

Debates are a means to present and refute, in a Christian manner, *propositions* on a variety of subjects. It is important that the aspects of this work be acknowledged. It underscores extremely important characteristics of Christian Evidences. The books which are produced from these debates are not lifeless ink on pages. They are the labors of energetic minds of real people. Those who debate the atheists must have patience and prudence. Brothers Dave Miller, Eric Lyons, Caleb Colley and Wayne Jackson recommend brother Butt's book.

DO NOT WORRY

"Then He said to His disciples, Therefore I say to you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat; nor about the body, what you will put on. ²³ Life is more than food, and the body *is more* than clothing. ²⁴ Consider the ravens, for they neither sow nor reap, which have neither storehouse nor barn; and God feeds them.
