

As A Man Thinketh

Teaching and learning biblical principles are endeavors to eliminate all thinking which is loathsome to God. The goal is to carefully, deeply and deliberately weigh all situations of life and prepare to be spiritually minded. Willpower, self-control, schooling, orderliness and efficiency are rules to guide all into subordination to the high calling of Christ Jesus. Except for each seeking to let our lives be worthy of the gospel, our varied backgrounds would make unity next to impossible (Philippians 1:27; Romans 12:16; 15:16).

Jesus demonstrated that preparedness is proven by one's disposition and lifestyle. Reasonable minds can become exceedingly skillful and productive when trained through proper education. Education must define and refine by helping students to accurately absorb and assimilate axioms (truths) for present and future use. Good thinking understands that accepted biblical truths are the only foundation for classifying results sought and expected.

Following are some references for helping us to understand the Bible alike:

God spoke from eternity and by inspiration through the Bible. The entire Bible is predicated on truth. It must be commonly held that there was a Creator and He remains our sustainer. It is sane to want to know and please such a Being.

God's mind is found in the Bible. The Bible is not man's effort to know or reach God. It is the effort of God to reach man, whom He knows. It is the record of God speaking to His creatures and is overwhelmingly accurate.

Accurately translated, the Bible is found useful in modern languages and can be communicated intelligibly in tongues commonly spoken by mankind. With our contemporary techniques we can arrive at an accurate and correct translation from the ancient Hebrew and Greek, which were first forms of biblical writings.

The original autographed (handwritten) books of the Bible were free from error. No other book is like the Bible. It is imprinted with a special origin. It emerged from the mind of God. An assortment of studies made by honest men in sciences from a number of fields verifies the accuracy of the Bible. It stands alone.

The Bible insists that it is complete and final. All grand themes of human and divine relationships have completeness in the New Testament. We are in want of no further

revelation. The scriptures can make us wise unto salvation.

Modern man can understand the Bible. Man has a shrewd mind with highly functional powers of deliberation and can analytically draw conclusions. Our mind is not our god. It is used to know our God. The mind should be made a servant to seek the divulged will of God.

As a heavenly message the Bible has earthbound and eternal consequences. The Bible is logical to man if he will put the time into studying. Mysteries of the Old Testament are revealed in the New Testament. Mankind can discover what is necessary for his well-being and what is pleasing to God by reading the Bible.

The Bible is rightfully a book with divine authority. On all that pertains to life and godliness, old wives' tales, injustice, egotism, wishful thinking and preconceptions impair use of the Bible as a divinely given book and final authority.

The authority of the Bible demands compliance to an all wise Creator. Right thinking leads to only one conclusion. This conclusion will be that on the Day of Judgment books will be opened, all will be judged from what is written within them.

Mankind is able to reason (Acts 17:11), know truth (1 Corinthians 15:1-4) and remember (John 8:32). He is able to be pure in thought (Philippians 4:8; Colossians 3:2). "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he" (Proverbs 23:7)

Thinking embraces the entire scope of life. An individual is literally the complete sum of his thoughts. The seeds of thoughts will produce the belief and practices of an individual's life. Thought provides for the courage to contend with life's vicissitudes. Deliberation builds a strong defense against the "evil one". Living for Christ is the deliberately directed dedication of a disciple. Thought is where the sweet and bitter parts of life are examined. Bring for fruits worthy of God is an act of forethought. Thought in the mind makes us. What we are by thought we work at and build upon. If one is to endure in purity there must be thoughtfulness.

Cause and effect teaches us that preparation beforehand is measured by success. Undeviating in the hidden world of thought will manifest itself in righteous deeds. A noble and godlike character is not a thing of chance. Right comes of a long-cherished association with the Book of books which groves the mind. Mankind is made and unmade by itself. Lives are forged and fashioned in the quite reflections of the mind. An individual fashions the tools to build a heavenly will clothed in strength by thought.

Right choices and true application of thought is attended by right moral and spiritual actions. All the beauty pertaining to the soul are based upon the "Master" molding the mind, heart and will of man (Mat 22:37). Transforming and renewing the mind comes when one knows the good, acceptable and perfect will of God.

Bibliolatry

A towering axiom is that every false teacher will repudiate the Bible as a single guide for the Christian Religion. When men endorse more than the Bible (creeds, doctrines of men, etc.) or hold to continuous revelation, it is more than God sanctions or will accept. If such teachers because of preconceived beliefs will not accurately exegete (critically analyze or explain a word or literary passage leading to its understanding) they make the Bible allegorical (a fable or love letter) and are like pagan philosophers who reduce divine commandments to gibberish. The Bible is neither a mystical allegory nor a perplexing conglomeration of characteristics changing with each incoming and outgoing culture. The Bible is not a scientific exegesis; neither does it base its exegesis upon traditions of a congregation of the church.

The Lord's church cannot live in profound ignorance of the Bible. After having begun and been guided into the fullness of doctrine by the Apostolic oversight the church does not adapt herself to modern traditions and doctrines fostered nearly 2000 years later. No new principles of exegesis or hermeneutics can be developed by traditions, lore or authority of the church. The current fitness of the Lord's church demonstrates that many congregations and Christians are abysmally underdeveloped in the basic fundamentals of reflecting correctly on Scripture. Many are under the spell and urgings of interpreters of the Bible who hold no allegiance to it. It is seen in language of books written by renegade authors who take liberties with every item from fundamental oracles of God on how to become a Christian, to acts of worship. This does not mean we need a **renaissance** of what is important to develop, nor a reformation of principles, just a concerted effort of calling attention to the origin of the church. It takes a seed (the word of God), a heart and faithful obedience to become a Christian. The church does not determine what the scriptures teach; scriptures preclude what the church must teach. When there is an outrage and a willingness to expose the falseness of abnormal teachings derived from private judgments emphasizing the destruction of the Bible, there will be an outcry for faith building and spiritual insights everywhere.

The **significance of typicals** found in the Old Testament must be stressed. The Messianic teachings of the Psalms, Prophets and Law cannot be overlooked if we are to capture the meaning of the New Testament. We must allow the writers of the New Testament to say what they said and not attribute to them what we think they ought to say.

A spirit of reaction has often positioned control in the hands of those who dogmatically deny the Verbal, Plenary Inspiration of the Bible. Adherence to Verbal Inspiration is not a theory that in different parts of the Bible inspiration varies in degree. It is all inspired or not at all. Partial inspiration limits faith and morality by its denial of supernatural illumination of Scriptures. If the divine element of the Bible is disparaged it reflects on God and borders on blasphemy.

Testimonials and witnessing of a "personal indwelling" is inadmissible for making any change in Biblical teachings. Consequences of such actions lead to false teachings and disregard for the Bible. Ignoring the doctrine of inspiration **denies permanently** the validity of the Bible.

A term used and flung about by false teachers is "Bibliolatry". This is an effort to make the Bible seem like an "idol" to the church. Such an outcry of indignation by the church <u>should arise</u> that these false teachers lose all degree of credibility. This accusation is fallacious and blasphemes the body of Christ (church) bought with His own blood. The Bible is <u>not an idol</u>, but a divinely inspired volume upon which the church relies for her existence.
