What about Christmas?

Many Christians have struggled with how they should respond to Christmas. Some Christians will not acknowledge the holiday in any shape, form or fashion, fearing that even giving gifts would violate their conscience and lead to sin. This belief is based on Rom. 14:23. ("But he who doubts is condemned if he eats, because he does not eat from faith; for whatever is not from faith is sin.") Other Christians go all the way on the other side and celebrate the "birth of Jesus" on December 25th. So, what is the truth and what does the Bible say about a celebration of the birth of Christ?

First, I want to include all the verses in the Bible that use the word Christmas. (______) Second, I want to also include all the scriptures in the Bible that command Christians to remember and celebrate the birth of Christ. (______) That is the totality of what the Bible says and/or commands us to do concerning the observance of the birth of Christ.

What is the truth about Christmas? The English term Christmas means "mass on Christ's day." The Bible never specifies the date of Jesus' birth; however, in 221 A.D. a man by the name of Sextus Julius Africanus "selected" December 25 as the birth date of Jesus, and over time this was "accepted" as the day Jesus was born. Pope Julius I officially named December 25th for the Catholic church. The celebration would evolve over the centuries with various characters added at different times.

Paul would address the observance of pagan holidays by Christians in Col. 2:16 when he said, "...let no one judge you in food or in drink, or regarding a festival or a new moon or Sabbaths," but also warned "...when you did not know God, you served those which by nature are not gods. But now after you have known God, or rather are known by God, how is it that you turn again to the weak and beggarly elements, to which you desire again to be in bondage? You observe days and months and seasons and years. I am afraid for you, lest I have labored for you in vain" (Gal. 4:8-11). Finally to the saints at Rome, Paul wrote, "One person esteems one day above another; another esteems every day alike. Let each be fully convinced in his own mind." (Rom. 14:5) Although there is no clear prohibition by Paul, it can certainly be a dangerous area if we are not careful.

The holiday season is an excellent opportunity for Christians to practice Christianity to the glory of God. (Matt. 5:16) We can do good to all (Gal 6:10); we can practice "pure religion" by reaching out to widows and orphans (James 1:27); and we can be grateful and humble for all of God's blessings.(1 Thess. 5:18) Regardless, we must insure that whatever we say or do is in compliance with God's word and specifically what is authorized in God's word. (Col. 3:17)

A Christian should not celebrate a date or event as part of worship or spiritual service outside of God's word. Can a Christian celebrate peace, good, love, and charity? Absolutely.

A Message from Our Shepherd

We started a conversation about courage last week and since this is the last article for the year let us again revisit this wonderful subject.

Courage is the heart and soul of encouragement. Like Peter, modern Christians will find that some days they behave with more courage than others. When courage is activated, it enables ordinary people to uphold their convictions and accomplish their dreams. By overcoming bad attitudes, mistaken beliefs, and negative expectations, you can begin living courageously.

Courage is a divine resource needed by all people. It is not reserved for prophets or police officers. The lives of ordinary people may not be as glamorous as those in high risk or high-profile occupations, but their need for strength to deal with day-to-day struggles is no less real. It takes courage to discipline children in a permissive society. It takes determination to decline lucrative job opportunities that infringe on family life. It takes nerve to seek fulfillment as a homemaker in a liberated world. Courageous men and women endure, bear up, tough it out, and keep on keeping on.

Courage is what it takes to follow through on goals despite hardships or difficulties. It enables students to study when they would prefer to play. It empowers athletes to work out when they would like to sleep in. It inspires dieters to eat sensibly when they would rather indulge. More than anyone else, Christians should recognize that courage is needed on a daily basis. What should a person do when asked by the boss to falsify information on insurance forms? It requires boldness for a Christian to share his faith with friends and coworkers. It takes guts to contend for the faith against false teaching. Courage makes it possible for an individual to stand up for what he or she believes even when it is unpopular.

So, as we come to the close of 2019 let us be courageous in our lives and realize that it is God who we are to please and not man.
