#### **Reverence Of God**

Any observant Bible reader who compares the Bible with other books follows a general rule of taking its words in an admiring manner. The difference between inspiration and mental preparation are vastly different. Universally the Bible has been found to be superior to any other volume known to man. Critics and skeptics try to make the Bible a "valedictorian hurrah" of Israel, a "scruffy" or at best a "motley" effort of a group of Christians who pretentiously claimed to have some special insight about how to live honestly and godly. Prominently in the Bible are indexed subjects which will grant a spiritual awakening causing a reader to alter a course of life in such a profound way that they willingly face fiery trials and rejoice that God has found them faithful to be able to carry the unsearchable riches of the gospel to the lost and dying (1 Pet 4:12-19; 1 Tim 1:12-

Fear of the Lord is mentioned countless numbers of times in scripture and is of special interest to the believer. Reverence is expressed as a respectful attitude and esteem for God. The name of God is reverenced (Mat 6:9). In worship God is reverenced (Jn 4:24; Psm 89:7). Keeping His ways demonstrates reverence and awe of God. God's names bring into focus the need to give Him our profound respect and love (Heb 12:28; Jn 4:8; Tit 1:2). His commands are to be held in the highest regard (Jn 12:50). By letting our light shine before men we manifest the glory of God (Mat 5:16). The main thought found in reverence is expressed in attitude and bearing toward God. Humbling ourselves before Him is a demonstration of awe and respect because He is superior to all (Jas 4:10).

The action of submission and humility is commonplace with those who seek God's approval. Because of His majesty and holiness God causes a feeling of veneration and godly fear in those who serve and love Him (Heb 12:8-10). An analogy is that the proper attitude is subjection because of love and not dread. This spiritual desire creates a mental imagery of willingly setting God higher than all others while placing oneself beneath Him in humble service (Heb 12:9). Admiration and awe are a respectful submission of mind, heart and will resulting in affection and esteem for God as the Sovereign One (1 Tim 6:11-16). As the house of God, Christians must determine that there is a special behavior by which the church of the Living God will regulate themselves because they are the pillar and ground of truth (1 Tim 3:14-16). Christianity is not a "last hurrah" but is the life which leads to eternal life. Amid the choirs of those who contradict the Christian way of life and wresting of scriptures, the student of the Bible still sees that the Word of God is different (2 Pet 3:14-18). Knowing this beforehand Christians are to beware lest being carried away with errors of the wicked ones they fall from their steadfastness (Jn 14:23, 24). The test of commitment handily shapes the way a Christian lives. Those of unfair minds express themselves in countless deceitful ways, hiding the truth and evidence of Christ and His glory. Christians seek occasion to rise above quibbling offering reasons for being in awe of God.

The essential unity of the Holy Scriptures forms a divine library that is consistent and unified in its approach to the teachings about God, Christ and the Holy Spirit and all spiritual and religious aspects. This is a commandingly powerful reason for reverencing God. Over the years the influence of the Bible has forged a strong armor of God worthy to be worn by a Christian (Eph 6:10-20). The teachings of the Bible are all pieces of the Christian's actions and ways in general. All preconceptions are reduced to beggary in the presence of the gospel message. Casting off the preposterous and embracing the divine is what reasonable individuals do. The passionate love and allegiance, which death cannot destroy, is because of a peace of conscience which reigns in the heart of a believer. In reverence of God believers come to be swift in response to God's voice and demands.

Dramatically, more than equivalent to writings of men, the Bible bothers non-believers not because of what they cannot understand, but because of what they can understand. This practical truth is why many people show such hostility. The Bible demands a life regulated by spiritual principles. The interrelatedness of the gospel and spiritual blessings affects the state of one's soul. It is freely conceded that the Bible will not allow one to trifle with the person of God. Enquiries into why God is to be reverenced start and end in the Bible. Being in awe of God is authentic and beyond dispute because it is a pillar and practical foundation of fundamental Christianity. The Bible everywhere speaks of our Lord's graciousness and patient work of leading mankind toward salvation in Jesus Christ. Hard to understand passages, which the ignorant and unstable distort to their own destruction, make the disciple determined to emerge from Bible study competent to answer questions concerning their reverence of God (1 Pet 3:15). The extension of God's authority is measured by the submission of a believer to Him in all things. Difficultly in accepting God's proper plan is not because we cannot understand God's teachings. It is because the teachings are understood and choices are made to violate them (Heb 6:1-10). The proper or improper use of Bible teachings will have a profound effect on the respect, awe and reverence given to God. We have a cherished heritage central to a commitment to mightily reverence God. Praise Him!

# **Outward Man And Inward Man**

"And it came to pass, when they were come, that he looked on Eliab, and said, Surely Jehovah's anointed is before him. But Jehovah said unto Samuel, Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have rejected him: for Jehovah seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but Jehovah looketh on the heart. Then Jesse called Abinadab, and made him pass before Samuel. And he said, Neither hath Jehovah chosen this. Then Jesse made Shammah to pass by. And he said, Neither hath Jehovah chosen this. And Jesse made seven of his sons to pass before Samuel. And Samuel said unto Jesse, Jehovah hath not chosen these. And Samuel said unto Jesse, Are here all thy children? And he said, There remaineth yet the youngest, and, behold, he is keeping the sheep. And Samuel said unto Jesse, Send and fetch him; for we will not sit down till he come hither. And he sent, and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and withal of a beautiful countenance, and goodly to look upon. And Jehovah said, Arise, anoint him; for this is he. Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the midst of his brethren: and the Spirit of Jehovah came mightily upon David from that day forward. So Samuel rose up, and went to Ramah" (1 Sam 16:6-13).

Men look on the outward appearance rather than inward. Many of the convictions individuals holds are unobvious. Some traits are detectable because of mannerisms, such as, dress or outward cultural trappings. Hidden thoughts remain undisclosed (1 Cor 2:6-13). Searching the deep things of an individual's life requires a disclosure on their behalf. An analogy of knowing the inner most feelings and desires of an individual is when the Father reveled Himself that mankind might know the deep things of God. The natural man and the spiritual man are important distinctions (2 Cor 4:14-16). The temporal and eternal are not easily separated. This has always been true, but never more so than in these last days, even among Christians (1 Cor 15:50-58).

Emphasis upon the carnal man is noticeable. When an individual seeks the glory of God there will be a shift from the carnal to the spiritual. Such a shift is seen in the language and habits of the one who seeks to please God. Telling signs are the emphasis placed on the immortal man. While it is very important to care for the physical man, the inner man must be fed day by day (1 Pet 2:1, 2; 1 Cor 3:18-23). The wise man seeks the wisdom of God and displays it in manners of life and speech. The Bible speaks of dress and embellishments, "I will therefore that. . . . women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; not with broided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array; But (which becometh women professing godliness) with good works" (1 Tim 2:8-11). Such a principle would surely also apply to men.

**Physical conditioning and care** are important. The greater importance is the inward man. "Bodily exercise profiteth little: but godliness is profitable unto all things"(1 Tim 4:6-16). A most effective way of judging a man will be his service to God. Nothing is wrong with physical beauty and strength unless the attention of such is wherein our value lies. "...Judge not by appearance, but judge righteous judgments (Jn 7:24).
