Authority Of Christ

Christianity claims Jesus Christ was God in human flesh. This is an absolutely essential doctrine to Christianity. If it is true Christianity has divine authority for what it teaches and practices. If not it is just one of many religions of men. It is true!

The New Testament is absolutely reliable as a record of Jesus Christ, His life, teachings, death, resurrection and ascension to the right hand of the Father. The eyewitnesses to Jesus were willing to die, be jailed or give up all they possessed to confirm Jesus as the Messiah (1 Cor 15:1-23). Jesus taught He was the Son of God, incarnate and proved it with many infallible proofs (Jn 20:30, 31; Heb 2:1-5). He fulfilled all prophecies concerning Him in the Psalms, Prophets and the Law (Lk 24:44-48). Christianity is a historical religion. It makes historical claims about miraculous events and confirms them by signs, wonders and manifold gifts of the Holy Spirit. There is abundant and accurate manuscript evidence for the New Testament. More than any other book in the world the New Testament has the greatest accuracy. Partial manuscripts, on papyrus, like the John Rylands and Bodmer, date back to the late first and early second century. The vellum, [mammal skin prepared for writing or printing on] manuscript, called Codex Vaticanus [324AD], has the entire New Testament as well as the Greek (LXX) Old Testament. The Codex Sinaiticus [340AD], also vellum contains the New Testament and part of the Old Testament. Codex Ephraemi Rescriptus [350AD], Codex Alexandrinus [450AD], Codex Bezae [450AF] and other early manuscripts such as Codices Claromontanus, Basiliensis and Laudianus add enormous amounts of documentation to verify that the Bible is accurate. These are followed by numerous other lesser known manuscripts. The total of Greek manuscripts are around 5,000, 76 papyri, 250 uncials [written entirely in capital letters], 2,646 minuscules [a group of writing styles in lower case Greek or Latin] and 1997 lectionary [book or listing that contains a collection of scripture readings]. No other book from antiquity possesses anything like this abundance of manuscript evidence. Comparisons to all other ancient text, accepted as true, demonstrate that the greater weight of evidence is with the Bible. No other book is

even a close second to the Bible in numbers of volumes to verify it's validly. The New Testament boasts thousands of copies of the Bible in private libraries and countless quotes among the books of the second century and beyond. The degree of the New Testament's accuracy is unable to be compared by other books. The New Testament is superior to compliable writings of all times. The manuscripts were given to us within the generation of the completion of the original New Testament Documents. Being linked to the first century Christian, who could verify and bear testimony to their correctness, lends enormous weight to their purity and accuracy. Because of their accuracy the teachings that Jesus has all authority in heaven and on earth stands unquestioned (Mat 28:18-20). Jesus is King of kings, Lord of lords (Rev 19:16). He is as the Bible claims, God (Acts 2:1-47).

The writers of the New Testament were scrutinized by friend and foe. No one in the first century denied their authenticity. Paul's writings agree with all the other New Testament writers. Paul challenged his readers to check with eyewitnesses for alleged distortions or discrepancies. There were more than 500 to which they could turn (1 Cor 15:15). There is no indication from history that Paul was ever challenged. Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Peter, James and Jude remain as links to the writings of Paul and they all agree on man, sin, God, Christ, the Holy Spirit, grace and all areas of Christian living. No other book with multiple writers is in such agreement. Moreover, they all agree with the Old Testament on these and other subjects. There are no contradictions in the Bible. The crucial testimony of eyewitnesses concerning life, death and the resurrection is sufficient to give validity to all else in the New Testament. No other like testimony is possessed for any such events or writings from ancient times. In summary the vast number of independent eyewitnesses to the life, teachings, miracles and countless other events in the Life of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whose integrity is unquestionable, stands as unassailable. The sanity of the witnesses wherein there is no mass hallucinations or delusions eliminates fraud.

The New Testament does not grow from details over many years. It was written in the time and at the place the events took place. Every event, place, circumstance, individual and all else could have been checked by the nay sayers. First century writers confirmed the historical outline of the Bible. Archeological evidence overwhelmingly confirms the New Testament. Both the authenticity and historicity of the New Testament documents are firmly established. The Jesus of the New Testament truly has all authority to establish His church and guide it by His word throughout the centuries.

FAMILY CARE A Message from Our Shepherds

Great distances separated the early congregations of the Lord's church and yet there seems to be a fair amount of communication between them as evidenced by the words of Paul. As he writes to the church at Rome he indicates that he has yet to see them face to face (Romans 1: 10 - 12). It is generally believed that he is writing this letter from Corinth (some 600 plus miles away) and yet someone would deliver this letter personally to the church in Rome.

Today we pick up the telephone, or send e-mail, or just get in a car or board a plane and there we are. Perhaps, as a result of our being closer together, we know too much about other churches even when they are located at the other end of the country. The possibility for gossip about brethren in other congregations certainly exists today as it has in every age--and of that we need to be careful.

As an individual Christian in a local congregation, like Belt Line Road, you need to be one who takes a stand for the truth. When you come to the point of searching for those who would have influence within the congregation (elders, preachers) then you must not believe that someone else will take care of it. Paul would tell you that you are responsible for being watchful. He notes in Romans 16: 17: "Now I urge you, brethren, keep your eye on those who cause dissensions and hindrances contrary to the teaching which you learned, and turn away from them."

We all have a responsibility to be aware of what is happening around us as we function as a congregation of the Lord's church. Anything less will allow for a diluted message resulting in a people who are not only ill prepared for everyday living but possibly lack the necessary relationship with God that is needed for eternity.

"Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial among you, which cometh upon you to prove you, as though a strange thing happened unto you: but insomuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings, rejoice; that at the revelation of his glory also ye may rejoice with exceeding joy. The Armor of God was the study for this year's Vacation Bible School. Belt Line Road Church of Christ is worthy of honor for such a grand history of teaching classes to the young and mature in her VBS program. Through the years countless hours and effort have been expended to make it a success. Those who pray, plan and participate have been consistently a unique body of believers. The leaders and teachers are the "heart-beat" of the process. They assure us that all is well as students go from class to class and teachers present their lessons. With two years through kindergartens in our younger classes we often see "concerned parents" watching and waiting, only to smile as their children settle into one of the classes and enjoy the VBS.

The ladies who put out an array of cookies [given by the brethren] make refreshments a pleasant time. Giving the children a choice of cookies and beverages is fun to watch. With the "little ones" it is an especially a "big deal" to choose a cookie!

Each year the students meet our enrollment "cast" who sign them in and give them a name tag. We use this information "in case" of a circumstance where we might need to contact a parent. This information also allows us to visit the students and family and invite them back for our Sunday and Wednesday classes. They first go to the Junior Auditorium where they sing, prepare to go to class and then return to sing, pray and be dismissed. On our last evening we present a book or Bible to the young person who brought the most visitors. This year **Tandy Garrett** won the award. She was excited about VBS and invited her friends! The eagerness on the young peoples' faces and in their voices "upstages a super bowl"!

Each teacher has a special part in the overall VBS. The older classes go from class room to class room where they study with a teacher about part of the overall VBS theme. The teachers decorate their rooms with our theme. The classes sit at the feet of some of the world's greatest Christians. These teachers have lived the Christian life and now teach what they live. All other individuals manifest the same character wherein the children are "literally surrounded with Christlike individuals and saintly souls". There is no better place on earth for a child to be.

The adult class is similar to the youth classes. The subject is the same. Each year the brethren attend and support the VBS. Usually some parents of the students sit in on the class while waiting for their children to be released to go home.

We have 38 brethren who come every evening to teach, assist, register, lead, song lead, hand out refreshments, count and do many unseen parts of the work. Each evening VBS increased. On Monday we had a total of 104, Tuesday 106 and Wednesday 113. This was a great success!

Our Elders are always supportive of this week of work. They allow us to have all the necessary items we need to make the VBS a success. We who teach and work in the VBS are appreciative of their supportiveness. Last but not least there are those who are behind the scenes Who Do! Their help is indispensible and cherished. I hope everyone had a wonderful time and are looking forward to next year.
