

## THE GOSPEL PLAN OF SALVATION

#### All Sin Is Lawlessness- 1 Jn 3:4

Recently an individual used the word "legalist". He is a former member of the church of Christ who now attends a group which has chosen to use instrumental music in their worship. This group has removed any hint of association to the churches of Christ "because the 'church of Christ' is offensive". This challenging term "legalism" is being thrown at members of the church of Christ by those who are seeking to defeat her purpose and manner of life. This term is pejorative [tending to make or worsen by disparaging and belittling remarks]. Legalist refers to those who over-emphasize discipline seemingly conduct and worship implying that those who practice "lawfulness" are misguided, pride filled, superficial and dogmatic. It implies that the church denies the grace of God, neglects mercy and emphasizes only the letter of the "law". There are accusations of preeminent principles of "lawfulness" as being judgmental. Judgmental to them is making judgments, especially moral or personal, which are intolerant. Tolerance today goes beyond a dictionary. Tolerance is to recognize another's belief but not share them. It means to "put up with something not especially liked". That is not so today. The new tolerance is to tolerate anyone who tolerates you, but to be intolerant of anyone who disagrees with you. Christians act toward others with respect and defend the faith delivered to them, giving an answer for their principles and practices (2 Tim 2:25; Jude 3). That is not tolerated today by the individual who used the word "legalist".

Legalist and legalism do not appear in the Bible. There is divine law [Law of the Spirit, Law of Christ, Perfect law, Royal Law and Law of Liberty]. God's ways are guided by law, not by whimsical fancies. Individuals are approved or condemned by the scriptures. The scriptures will be used in judgment (Rev 20:12, 13). New tolerance sounds like what has been taught, but there is a change based upon the assumption that "truth is relative to the community and with many communities there are many truths". The claim is that every belief, lifestyle or perception of truth is equal. The new tolerance is that any practice must be tolerated or judgment upon others is called "legalism". Strange how the tide has turned! It

is odd that it is ungodly to know God's law and practice it. Legalism is confused with obedience, wherein is the announcement of grace, mercy not merit or works done to equate with earning salvation (Eph 2:1-23). Sin is lawlessness (1 Jn 3:1-12). It is odd that the church of Christ is reviled because it does not seek to lead mankind astray, but loves mankind seeking to manifest the way of truth. Directing abhorrence against "law", subjects the Bible to ridicule. No man would serve a "lawless God". Bringing the Old Testament into the New Testament was the controversy found in Acts 15. To bring Psalms 150 up as proof of instrumental music is to fall from grace and be severed from Christ (Gal 5:1-12). In the first century there were "Judaizers". Groups of individuals who practiced "wresting the scriptures" were Pharisees, Sadducees and Scribes (Mat 23; 2 Pet 3:14-18). Modernists slander faithful brethren with the term "legalist".

**Obedience to the faith** is not legalism (Rom 1:1-5). The goal of Christianity is to receive grace which was brought about by obedience among the Jews and Gentiles. Grace, faith, obedience, peace and mercy are tied together and preaching the whole counsel of God is to proclaim them (Acts 20:17-34; 5:29, 32; Rom 16:19; 2 Cor 7:15). "Legalism" is confused with discipline (1 Tim 4:6-16; Heb 12:1-13). Mankind is not justified by works but by faith (Gal 2:16). The new tolerance is to elevate all values and beliefs. Better said, "...all beliefs are equal". The Bible makes it clear that not all lifestyles, beliefs and claimed "truths" are equal. The goal of New Tolerance is to achieve acceptance of persons of different beliefs or practices, but not to induce them to approve of Bible practices. Some think those who hold to the "old ways and walk therein" are candidates for "sensitivity training".

To imply that a person must worship in spirit and truth is a theological position untenable to the principles of the New Tolerance. Throughout church history Christianity has drawn charges of "legalism". To those who accuse the church of Christ of being "legalists" the truth does not exist objectively. Modernists claim it is a product of prayer, fasting and subjective reasoning. The Bible teaches the truth has been revealed and is not a social gospel. Worshiping to some is now a "social function" wherein the activities of worship are arbitrary and subjective. "Anything goes and anything to get them in the door" is the new mantra. The declaration of the elimination of all forms of intolerance is to force the family of God to change her paradigm of the message that Jesus Christ is the only Savior and accept all other practices. Christians and Christianity is said to be out of stride with the post-modern world. However, the Old Jerusalem gospel is still in vogue with God.

#### FAMILY CARE A Message from Our Shepherds

"The standard of what is acceptable in religion for many is whether it satisfies the individual. Many "shop" for a religion that meets their personal preferences, treating the Scriptures as a salad bar--picking things they like and passing over others. Many declare satisfaction with the course they have chosen in religion without ever considering the question, "Is God satisfied with my religion?" The whole conclusion is not, serve God as you please, but "Fear God and keep His commandments" (Ecclesiastes 12:13). Our purpose in daily activities and in worship should be to strive to please God. Those who truly seek to serve God will not be satisfied until they do this. We must be willing to test our practices and beliefs to see if they agree with the Scriptures. "Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves" (2 Corinthians 13:5).

The only way to please God in all that we do is to follow His revealed will--to simply read and study the Scriptures and follow them in all we do, not adding to them or taking away (2 **Jn. 9**; **Deut. 4:2**). Those who fail to do this lack respect for the authority of God as Lord and Master. The inspired apostle declared, "And whatsoever ye do, in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord" (Colossians 3:17). To "do all in the name of the Lord" means to respect the authority of the Lord in everything. We must have God's authority for all that we do and that authority must be established from the Scriptures; for it is there that God has revealed His will for us.

So, our personal morality, conduct, religious beliefs, and things practiced in worship must be based on book, chapter, and verse. One may be satisfied with the manner in which they live and worship, while God may not be, making life and worship worthless before the Lord. As Jesus warned, "This people draweth nigh unto Me with their mouth, and honoureth Me with their lips; but their heart is far from Me. But in vain they do worship Me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men" (Matthew 15:8, 9). Therefore, let us search the Scriptures to establish authority for all that we believe and practice showing respect for God's authority."

#### **Christian Heritage Is Not For Sale**

**Christianity is a culture**. Culture is the "totality of socially transmitted behavior patterns, arts, beliefs, institutions, and all other products of work and thought". These patterns, traits, and products dominate a culture. Predominating attitudes and behavior characterize the function of a group or way of life.

**Cultural heritage** is a legacy of attributes by a society that are passed from one generation to another. Attributes are maintained for the benefit of future generations. Cultural heritage includes **tangibles** such as buildings, monuments and books. **Intangible** culture includes traditions, language, and knowledge.

The deliberate act of preservation is keeping a cultural heritage. Remaining sound, entire, uninjured, not impaired in any way in the present is to be a standard bearer for the future. It is a determination of the people of a culture. Conservation yields inestimable benefits. Cultural heritage is unique and irreplaceable. This places a responsibility of preservation on the current generation. The smaller part must be successfully transmitted in order to preserve a heritage for the future.

The first person to sell his heritage was Cain. His hatred for his brother dominated his actions (Heb 11; Jude; 1 Jn). To pass a culture of worship from one generation to the next is a preservation of way of life. Esau sold his heritage for a bowl of pottage. He was forever after known as one who was a "profane person" (Heb 12:14-17). Birthright and heritage go hand and hand. It is more than property. It is a way of life which is sacred. Naboth had a vineyard which had belonged to his family for generations. He cultivated it and cared for it to use it for his families' welfare and to pass it on to his children as a heritage. Ahab sought this vineyard for himself. When he could not obtain it he pouted. Jezebel had Naboth killed and gave the property to Ahab (1 Kg 21:1-13). The contrast between Esau and Naboth is profound. Esau cared little for his birthright, while Naboth cared a great deal for his

Christianity is not a piece of property or things. Christianity is a way of life defined by the New Testament. Divine revelations have set forth what is to be practiced and what will be acceptable to God. The official teachings of the New Testament are not to be augmented, changed or altered in any form. The truth of the gospel of salvation is God's power unto salvation (Rom 1:16, 17). To preserve and deepen one's commitment to the ways of God is to never change any Bible standard or percept. One must know the truth and it will set free from darkness the soul of the obedient (Col 1:9-24). The commitment to the church and her heritage is measured by eternity. Being unappreciative of God's ways always leads to apostasy and destruction of the Christian heritage.

Christianity is not for sale at any price. Crafty and subtle worldly practices do nothing to promote Christianity. Additions to worship do not enhance. The aim of the Christian is to pass to the next generation the Christian heritage intact. Jesus paid the price for our heritage with His own blood (Acts 20:28). Many martyred brethren did what was necessary to preserve the Christian heritage. Let us consider the cloud of witnesses who resisted unto death (Heb 12:1-13). Endure and overcome the gainsayers, wax not weary, strive against sin. Run the race and keep the faith.
