"Can a Christian Be Politically Correct?"

In the world in which we live, it is becoming more and more difficult to keep up with the "social norms" when it comes to what can and cannot be said. Granted, our speech should always be "with grace, seasoned with salt" (Col 4:6) but it should always be "bold" (1 Thes. 2:2; 2 Cor. 3:12) when it comes to the word of God. There are many in our world who are trying to control the spread of the Gospel by demanding that only those things of which they approve are spoken. If what can be preached and taught is controlled or limited then the Gospel message is diminished in its power to save the lost soul (Rom. 1:16).

The Bible is full of examples of God's people suffering persecution for telling the truth. Jeremiah was thrown in prison because he refused to write and prophesy falsely to please the people (Jer. 38:1-6).

When Peter and John were pulled before the Sanhedrin for their preaching and teaching Peter told them "we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard." (Acts 4:20) Paul suffered tremendously because he refused to be "politically correct" with his preaching and teaching (2 Cor. 11:23-28). Paul warned Timothy that the time would come when Christians would seek teachers who would only teach the "politically correct" things for them to hear (2 Tim. 4:3-4). Jesus was murdered by the Jews because of what He said (Matt 26:65).

So, for the faithful child of God, rather than speak those things which will "tickle" the politically correct of the world, we commit to please God with what we say rather than men (Gal 1:10; Acts 5:29). When the words of the Bible are branded as "hate speech" we must have the courage to fight for the faith as delivered to the saints (Jude vs. 3). When our own brethren demand that we not speak the truth in love (Eph. 4:15) but rather speak "smooth words" as well as lies and deceits (Isa. 30:10), we must become even more bold in our determination to stand against the "wiles of the devil." (Eph. 6:11).

There is a saying that history repeats itself. The landscape of history is littered with the bodies of those who have refused to bow to the god of "political correctness." It may very well be in our lifetime in this country that the time will come where we will be forced to make the choice of serving God and truth or the world and the devil. The fight gets more intense every day. Inch by inch we see more and more the push to punish those who stand with God's word and truth. In many countries of the world persecution and death is an everyday possibility because what one says does not conform with societies norms. Let us pray that when that time comes for us that God will give us the courage to remain strong and never deny our Lord in order to be acceptable to the world (Matt. 10:32-33).
