Behold A Virgin Shall Conceive

Some translators of Isaiah 7:14 have supplanted the teaching of the virgin birth of Jesus Christ by changing "virgin" to "young woman shall conceive". It should appear to the reader that the "virgin" birth taught in the New Testament would be contradictory to a mere "young woman" (Mt 1:18-20; Lk 1:26-80). Moreover any attempt to deny Mary as a virgin is in error. Such translators claim that they are not giving up the virgin birth, but rather are translating the verse to accommodate. This is both illogical and absurd since Matthew, whom they assert is a correct translation of the Greek, is quoting from *Isaiah 7:14* and it supports the doctrine of the virgin birth of a Messiah. If Isaiah is wrong so is Matthew. "...Now the birth of Jesus Christ was on this wise: When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. And Joseph her husband, being a righteous man, and not willing to make her a public example, was minded to put her away privily. But when he thought on these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. And she shall bring forth a son; and thou shalt call his name JESUS; for it is he that shall save his people from their sins. Now all this is come to pass, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, And they shall call his name Immanuel; which is, being interpreted, God with us. And Joseph arose from his sleep, and did as the angel of the Lord commanded him, and took unto him his wife; and knew her not till she had brought forth a son: and he called his name JESUS" (Mat 1:18-25).

"... Now all this is come to pass, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet..." Matthew affirms this necessitating that *parthenos* [Greek] means virgin and that *almah* [Hebrew] is an exact equivalent meaning a "virgin-who had not known man". The teaching of the Bible cannot contemplate two women with two sons, one set in Isaiah and another being Mary and Jesus. It is either a "virgin" who was told by an angel that she would have the Holy Spirit come upon

her, the power of the Most High would overshadow her and the child begotten was to be called the Son of God or the New Testament lies, which I deny (Lk 1:26-38). Acceptance of the teaching of "a young woman" is soundly defeated by hermeneutics and ordinary rules of exegesis. Isaiah contemplates "the virgin", not just "one of many virgins". It is impossible to accept two women and two sons. The word for *virgin* used by Isaiah must match inspired passages in the New Testament. The question would be who was the woman and son in Isaiah if Mary and Jesus are those who fulfilled prophecy? A dual reference is incompatible with the New Testament.

Jesus Christ is Immanuel. It is not a "proper" name but rather who He was, Wonderful, Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father and Prince of Peace (Isa 9:6). There have not been two *Immanuels*. Jesus is properly "God with us". Jesus is not some unidentified son of a young woman. It was the Lord who told the prophet to write "virgin" and the subsequent fulfillment of the prophecy was an inspired "lexicography" [the principles and procedures involved in writing, editing, or compiling dictionaries] of the term "virgin", when we accept or recognize Matthew wrote by inspiration. Any practice which mitigates God's word to accommodate current thinking should be under suspicion. It is a dangerous characteristic to "translate" or facilitate the doubts of some that Jesus was not "virgin" born. Isaiah and Matthew are time honored passages teaching the virgin birth of Jesus Christ. They should not be set aside for a teaching so obviously influenced by false concepts and translations. The church of Christ must be a bastion of truth in the defense of the gospel.

Upholding the "virgin" birth of Jesus must be our task and sacred duty. The teaching of a"virgin birth" once lost can never be regained. Altering and changing the word of God, in the slightest form, has unexpected consequences. The enemies of Christianity see this as a discrepancy. The pure and faultless faith of saints is to never relinquish the text of the Scriptures to those who do not honor them. Disciples must contend for the faith delivered to them (Jude 3). There is no such thing as "academic liberties" with the sacred writings. The teachings of Isaiah and Matthew are entrusted to the Church. The inspiration of scriptures is being questioned. Proof of the Old and New Testaments' inspiration abound. Matthew 1 provides an inspired commentary on Isaiah 7 stating, "...now all this is come to pass, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son". The grandest prophecy of all times was fulfilled in Christ.

In our youth we can hardly wait to have the time pass in order that we might be adults and begin on our own. But when we awake to our new time, we find that we have overslept. It is not morning, but late afternoon or middle or old age. Like snow that has fallen during the night, so age has come upon us unexpectedly, time has passed more quickly than we anticipated. We long for the days of the past. We want again the spring time of life. But it is gone; we can't go back! We find ourselves on a road we cannot return. We must go on. We cannot look back and wish for the yesterdays.

Time is very valuable because during this period of human existence the destiny of all mankind is sealed. This life is man's probationary period; to neglect God's will for our lives will result in eternal loss of our souls (2 Thes. 1:7-9). Our future destiny depends upon the decisions we make and the actions we take now. Read (2 Thes 2:13-17). Today is the day of Salvation! Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is the act of giving thanks or expressing gratitude for favors or mercy received (Heb 4:14-16). Individuals correctly apprehending that benefits have been conferred give reason to pause and bring froth expressions of gratitude. Those who are blessed retain a memory of blessings and reveal their gratefulness. Gifts calls for evaluation of the inestimable love which comes from the gracious hand of God. When benefits are received they command a willingness of the mind of a believer to affectionately pay homage to the Giver.
