It's a Miracle

I have never witnessed the birth of a child. Many who actually witnessed a birth first hand have proclaimed what a "miracle" it is. Recently I read an account of someone who had "miraculously" survived an ordeal in the wilderness. We hear TV announcers proclaim "miraculous catches, plays or shots" in athletic games all the time. Are all of these and other "happenings" really miracles?

According to Merriam-Webster, in the English language, the word "miracle" can be defined as "an extraordinary event <u>manifesting</u> divine intervention in human affairs" or "an extremely outstanding or unusual event, thing, or accomplishment." Certainly, the latter definition would apply to all the above mentioned occurrences. However, like many words in our language, sometimes the way we use a word or the circumstances that cause the word to be used are not compatible with the true meaning of the event.

For example, when the Bible translates a word as "miracle" in the language of origin the word meant supernatural wonder or sign, which is in line with the English definition of divine intervention. In other words, when God caused the sun to stand still (Josh. 10:13), that was miraculous divine intervention. When Jesus turned ordinary water into wine (John 2:1-10), this was indeed a miracle of divine intervention in human affairs. When God parted the waters of the Red Sea and the Israelites walked across on dry land (Ex. 14:21-22), this was supernatural divine intervention: a "miracle."

Miracles of a divine nature have always served an important purpose. Jesus told His disciples that they would be able to perform miracles so that the Word of God might be confirmed. (Mk. 16:17-20) The Apostles, as well as those on whom the Apostles laid their hands, were able to perform miracles throughout their ministry even to the point of raising the dead, confirming that they were receiving their power from God who was blessing their efforts. (Acts 9:36-41) Once the word was confirmed and was "once for all delivered to the saints" (Jude 3), the miracles of divine intervention ceased as the perfect had come. (1 Cor. 13:8-10; James 1:25) Biblical evidence that the miraculous power given to Christians by the laying on of the Apostles hands (Acts 6:6-8; 8:17-18) could be transmitted by the recipient does not exist. (Acts 8:13)

Even our English use of the word miracle makes the clear distinction between events that are unusual or outstanding and those that are the result of divine intervention because some make no distinction. But the Bible limits miracles by divine intervention to a specific time, purpose, and method. Someone might ask if saying there is no miraculous divine intervention today is limiting God. COULD God miraculously intervene in human events today? Absolutely! Then why could I not ascribe an event today as divine intervention? Because God limited Himself when He said that those miracles would end. It is not US limiting God, but God limiting Himself. Truly outstanding or unusual events, things or accomplishments today, are great, but are not the result of divine intervention, according to the Bible.

Both sizes can be broken. I have traveled all over Africa and have taken unleavened bread in many different shapes and sizes. The important thing is to remember Jesus the Christ and His love for us.

1 Corinthians 11:24-29 (NKJV)

²⁴ and when He had given thanks, He broke *it* and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me." ²⁵ In the same manner *He* also *took* the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink *it*, in remembrance of Me."

²⁶ For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes.

Examine Yourself

²⁷ Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks *this* cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. ²⁸ But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. ²⁹ For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body.
