

THE GOSPEL PLAN OF SALVATION

Hear - Romans 10:17 Believe - John 8:24 Repent - Acts 17:30 Confess - Romans 10:10 Be Baptized - Acts 22:16 Saved - in Christ (Galatians 3:27)



Calvinism (Part Eleven) – Limited Atonement Doug Post

Having discussed *Unconditional Election*, we now turn our attention to analyzing another major tenet of Calvinism referred to as *Limited Atonement*. According to Calvinism, God arbitrarily choses everyone to either be saved or condemned. Man has no free will in the matter. However, the doctrine of *Limited Atonement* teaches that Christ died only for the elect – only for those chosen to be saved. This necessarily implies that if you did not make it on the Lord's *Unconditional Election* "list," then Christ did not shed His blood for you, because Christ died only for the *elect* – those unconditionally elected. Therefore, Christ's atonement for sin is said to applied or limited to God already chose to be saved.

- JOHN 3:16 ACCORDING TO CALVINISM: "For God so loved THE ELECT that He gave His only begotten Son for ONLY THE ELECT, that WHOEVER OF THE ELECT believes in Him, WILL NOT perish, but have everlasting life."
- JOHN 3:16 ACCORDING TO THE BIBLE: "For God so loved THE WORLD that He gave His only begotten Son, that WHOEVER believes in Him, SHOULD NOT perish, but have everlasting life."

The Bible teaches Jesus came to seek and save the lost (Luke 19:10). However, the doctrine of *Limited Atonement* implies the *unconditionally elect* are the only lost folks. What do you mean, Doug? Just this. If, in the long ago, God chose some to be permanently saved and some to be permanently lost, then to whom did Jesus come seeking and saving? Moreover, if God is totally in control, per Calvinism, then how could a person be **lost**? Did God "lose" and "find" the same one at the same time?

If the *unconditionally elect* folks are saved, and Jesus came to seek and save the lost, then, the elect who are permanently saved from the foundation of the world, must be the ones who were lost. But how can that be since the saved are always saved and the lost are always lost? Since the *unconditionally elect* were *elected* way before the crucifixion of Christ, then what is the need of the crucifixion? Paul speaks of the Ephesians as having been dead in their trespasses and sins, lost and separated from God (Eph.2:1-3) being without hope and without God in the world – while alive and living on earth at that time (Ephesians 2:12). If they were *unconditionally elected* in eternity, then how could they ever have been lost prior to Paul's letter to them?

Paul writes: "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Cor.1:18). A contrast is made between those "perishing" and those "being saved." Both are present tense or continuous action. Paul is saying that the condition of the lost is not static (unchangeable) but neither is the condition of the saved. However, if one is without Christ, then that person finds him or herself in the process of perishing. It is by no means a "done deal." The current condition is not permanent, if one repents and turns to Christ. Those who are lost are those without Christ, not because God chose them to be lost. All people have free will to choose Jesus and live, taking advantage of His atoning and cleansing blood, or not. His atoning sacrifice is not limited to a few but is for ALL. The Bible closes with an invitation from heaven: "And the Spirit and the bride say, "Come!" And let him who hears say, "Come!" And let him who thirsts come. Whoever desires, let him take the water of life freely" (Rev.22:17). The Spirit, by His inspired and completed word, and the church that goes into all the world with the Spirit's word, invites ALL to come accept the atoning sacrifice of Christ.
