

THE GOSPEL PLAN OF SALVATION

ROMAN CATHOLICISM – THE PAPACY (PART 1) Doug Post

Christians are always to be "speaking the truth in love" (Eph.4:15). The verb "speak" is in the present tense, which carries the idea of ongoing or continual action, which means, "continue speaking the truth in love." There are no exceptions. We are told to "contend earnestly for the faith" (Jude 3), which is regulated by "speaking the truth in love."

While we are indeed at liberty to examine or criticize any doctrine that is contrary to Scripture, we are to do so in love. Therefore, we must separate personality from the doctrine one follows. Yes, we may expose error (Eph.5:11), but we are not at liberty to wound the soul of the one or ones to said error. As David wrote, "**Through thy precepts I get understanding, therefore I hate every false way**" (Psalm 119:104). He does not say to hate the person, just the error they follow.

This is the first part of several articles dealing with Roman Catholicism. I have many friends who are Roman Catholic. Many years ago, I attended East Catholic High School and developed many life-long friendships. Many of my relatives are Roman Catholic. In fact, my mother came out of Roman Catholicism. There are many good, loving, and caring people who are members of that organization. The intentions of this study concern only what is taught – not people.

The most significant tenet of Roman Catholicism is the papacy, and upon that tenet said organization stands or falls. It is argued that from the apostle Peter to the current pope, pope Francis, there has been spiritual lineage:

Papacy, the office and <u>jurisdiction</u> of the <u>bishop</u> of Rome, the <u>pope</u> (Latin *papa*, from Greek *pappas*, "father"), who presides over the <u>Holy See</u> (the central government) of the <u>Roman Catholic Church</u>. The term *pope* was originally applied to all the bishops in the West and also used to describe the patriarch of Alexandria, who still retains the title. In 1073, however, Pope <u>Gregory VII</u> restricted its use to the bishop of Rome, confirming a practice that had existed since the 9th century. According to the *Annuario Pontificio*, the papal annual, there have been more than 260 popes since <u>St. Peter</u>, traditionally considered the first pope.¹

Here is a flavor of what Catholic scholars have said concerning the pope and or the papacy:

Our Lord God the pope; another God upon earth, king of kings, and lord of lords. The same is the dominion of God and the pope. To believe that our Lord God the pope might not decree, as he decreed, it were a matter of heresy. The power of the pope is greater than all created power, and extends itself to things celestial, terrestrial, and infernal. The pope doeth whatsoever he listeth [wills], even things unlawful, and is more than God" (Dissertations on the Prophecies, London: B. Blake, Bell-Yard, Temple-Bar, 1831, p. 456).

"Take care that we lose not that salvation, that life and breath which thou hast given us, for thou art our shepherd, thou art our physician, thou art our governor, thou art our husbandman, thou art finally another God on earth."
