

"STRENGTHENED" (Part 1) Doug Post

That He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might through His Spirit in the inner man (Ephesians 3:16).

Concerning Ephesians 3:16 (as quoted above, NKJV), one prominent speaker said:

Paul was praying that 'He [God] would grant [give] you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with power through His Spirit in the inner man.' The fact that Paul was praying for strength rather than pointing the brethren to the 'word' is significant. While there can be no doubt that the Word strengthens (Rom. 16:25-27), Paul did not here point the Ephesians to the Word for strength but prayed for it. God, in answer to prayer, was to strengthen them 'with power' through (by means of) the Spirit. The Spirit was the medium through which God was to strengthen them with power. This strengthening took place in the inner man.¹

The above writer is teaching that the Holy Spirit must <u>literally</u> dwell within the body of a Christian, referred to as *the indwelling*. However, the Bible teaches that both the Father and the Son dwell in us. Why is that not *the indwelling*? We are said to dwell in God. Why is that not referred to as *the indwelling*? Dear friends, we are not <u>literally</u> residing within a Spirit being in heaven, any more than Deity is <u>literally</u> residing within our flesh here on earth. Why must Deity indwell human flesh in order to manipulate our minds. The Spirit does not have to be in us to manipulate us, neither must He literally be within our flesh so He can interpret our prayers to the Father. The Father is all knowing! The fact is, nowhere does the Bible teach a LITERAL indwelling of Deity in the body of the Christian.

It is then assumed that if the Holy Spirit literally resides inside us, then He must be doing something to us, from within us. Your body now becomes the *crane*, while the Holy Spirit becomes the *crane operator*, manipulating your mind so you can make the right decisions. However, since such a direct working of the Spirit upon the mind interferes with, and manipulates, your cognitive processes, so you can stand against temptation and avoid sin, then your *Free-Will* is destroyed. Any direct manipulation of our internal cognitive processes alters our free will, because we all think according to the desires of our hearts, whether good or bad (Prov.23:7; cf. Rom.2:4-11). If God directly interferes with our minds, then we are not allowed to think according to our own desires, and God would be doing the thinking for us, which is the absurd conclusion of the matter.

If the Holy Spirit literally resides inside our flesh to keep us from sinning [by a direct operation], then He is doing a very poor job. If that role were true, then the devil would never win and every spiritual battle we could ever face would be won. The devil would go from a "**roaring lion**" (1 Pet.5:8) to a purring kitty cat. Moreover, "once saved always saved" would be true, but that is not reality.

Additionally, prayer is NEVER divorced from the word of God (Eph.6:17-18; cf. Ja.4:2-3). The sword of the Spirit, within the same context, is the word of God. The above writer has the Spirit working separately from His sword, even though he specifically states the word of God strengthens the Christian. Yes, the Spirit strengthens the Christian, but through the means of His word He has provided us. Unfortunately, the concepts of agency and metonymy have been dismissed by the above writer as proper elements of hermeneutics (interpretation).
