

THE GOSPEL PLAN OF SALVATION

Hear - Romans 10:17 Believe - John 8:24 Repent - Acts 17:30 Confess - Romans 10:10 Be Baptized - Acts 22:16 Saved - in Christ (Galatians 3:27)



Calvinism (Part Ten) - Unconditional Election Doug Post

Unconditional Election, or "predestination," is the idea that God has chosen some to heaven and some to hell. Man has no choice in the matter. Accordingly, everyone's eternal destiny has already been pre-assigned, not matter if one is an obedient child of God or an ardent atheist.

God instructs us through the pages of the Bible, and has told us we are, indeed, chosen or elected, but not in the manner which Calvinism teaches. In a beautiful passage concerning our redemption through the Majesty of God, who deserves all praise, the apostle Paul writes the following: Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ, just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love, having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will, to the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He made us accepted in the Beloved (Eph. 1:3-6).

Paul did not say God "chose us" but that He chose us "in Him." Moreover, Paul is discussing *election* on an individual basis. Rather, he is discussing *election* concerning a *class* of people or a collective group of people. The *election* under consideration is of a collective nature, not an individual one. Additionally, this *election*, before the foundation of the world, involves being "in Christ." Therefore, God *chose* (elected, predestinated, predetermined, etc.) salvation to all those who would be "in Christ," before the foundation of the world, which is exactly where salvation is located: "that they also may obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory" (2 Tim. 2:10). While Jesus died for all of humanity, only those who are "in Christ" belong to Him because Jesus, "purchased the church with His own blood" (Acts 20:28) and He is the Savior of the body, the church (Eph. 1:22-23, 5:23). How did that occur? Plainly stated, the Hebrews writer declares that Christ, "became the author of eternal salvation to all who obey Him" (Heb. 5:9).

There is a process to *election*, which involves obedience to the gospel (Rom.1:16-17; 2 Thess.1:7-9; 1 Peter 4:17; cf. Matt.7:21; Luke 6:46). When one obeys the gospel, being baptized for the remission of sins (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38, 22:16; 1 Peter 3:21) then one enters Christ, having been baptized **INTO** Christ (Gal.3:26-27; Rom. 6:3-5). This plan of salvation is eternal, because it comes from an eternal God, having an eternal purpose (Acts 2:22-23; Eph.3:10-11). Paul writes, "Moreover brethren I declare to you the gospel which I preached to you, which also you received, and wherein you stand, by which also you are saved, **IF** you hold fast that word which I preached – unless you believed in vain" (1 Cor. 15:1-2).

In choosing the Jews, Yahweh became their God, and they became His people (2 Cor.6:16). But we also learn that not all His children would be saved, because He did not choose each individual Jew to be automatically saved and never be able to fall from grace. Instead, God chose the Jews, collectively, and this choosing did not automatically mean each individual Jew would be saved. Rather, it simply served as an opportunity, or a platform, from which they could choose to belong to Him, because only the righteous would be His. We read, "if My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land" (2 Chron.7:14). Brethren, the election of the Jews foreshadows our own.
