

"GOD-LIKE" Doug Post

Different people have different ideas about what would makes them happy. Unfortunately, most find their pursuit of happiness does not lead them where they want to go. They soon discover the things they've been pursuing aren't really the things needed for happiness. As Christians, however, we ought to realize that **the best things in life are the things that make us more like God.** To the extent that we begin to conform ourselves to the mind of God, we will find our lives getting better.

It is an interesting fact that many of the things we would define as "good" because they draw us closer to God are those that the world would define as "bad." For example, difficulty and pain can have a beneficial spiritual effect on us, but to say that these things are good is to say the opposite of what the world would say. James wrote, "**Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness**" (James 1:2-3). Seeing things from God's perspective often causes us to see things differently.

The "blessed" person, according to Jesus' description in the Beatitudes in Mt. 5:1-12, is not blessed because of his bank account, his importance in life, or his power over other people. He is blessed because he is a certain kind of person. He seeks to think and act as God would think and act. The blessedness of those in Christ's kingdom is a blessedness that comes from within the heart, and it has little to do with what is going on in the externals of a person's life. In fact, a person who enjoys the blessedness of godly character can say, "I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content" (Phil. 4:11).

This week, let's strive for a keener sense of what is most important in our lives. Investing in character growth, rather than accumulating the "stuff" the world considers essential for the good life. Let's try to set a better example for our children and grandchildren, showing them (by our deeds as well as our words) that our priorities are straight and that we are wanting, above all, to be the kind of people on the inside that pleases God and receive His blessings. Let's live as those who understand what the "good life" truly is.
