

YOU OR YOU? Doug Post

No matter what English translation of the Bible one reads, it is difficult to know whether the pronoun "you" is singular or plural. Often the context will help determine whether "you" is singular or plural in number. But there are occasions where even the context does not help. However, it is critical to know whether "you" is to be understood as singular or plural.

For instance, in 1 Corinthians 3:16-17, in writing to the church in Corinth, the apostle Paul says: "Do <u>you</u> know that <u>you</u> are temple of God and the Spirit of God dwells in <u>you</u>? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person. For the temple of God is holy, which temple <u>you</u> are."

We note that every "you" within the context is plural, not singular, which reads thusly: "Do you (plural, you all) not know that you (plural, you all) all are the temple (singular, not temples) of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in (among, or in the midst of) you (plural, you all)? If anyone destroys the temple (singular, not temples) of God, God will destroy that person. For the temple (singular, not temples) is holy, which temple you (plural, you all) are."

Paul is dealing with division within the church in Corinthians (1:10-13). Paul wants them to know that, collectively, they form the *temple of God*, and that the Spirit was in (or among) them, corporately, as the temple of God. And, if any individual destroys that temple/church (singular), God will destroy that person. Paul is addressing the church in Corinth as a whole.

Paul tells us plainly how the temple of God in Corinth was being destroyed: "For <u>you all</u> are still carnal, For where there are envy, strife, and divisions in (among) <u>you all</u>, are <u>you all</u> not carnal and behaving like mere men?" (1 Cor. 3:3). The local church can be destroyed by its members, and most certainly by its preacher and elders. Unfortunately, destruction of the temple of God is likely where carnal thinking, carnal motives, or carnal actions exist.

Of course, if any individual destroys the temple of God (and refuses to repent), God's promise is that He will destroy them. Therefore, we all must take God's threat very seriously. Grammatically, the several occurrences of the pronoun "you" are plural, and within the context, Paul is describing the church as a whole, not an individual.
