

GLORIFY THY NAME IN ALL THE EARTH

God desires a relationship with **YOU**. While there is one Divine Nature referred to as God, there are Three Divine Personalities who comprise that one Divine Nature. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, want to share the same closeness they have with each other, with **YOU**. The Creator of the universe greatly desired to be **YOUR** Friend, and because **YOU** accepted His salvation, **YOU** now enjoy that Divine friendship.

Of course, none of us would have this special relationship with God, were it not for the forgiveness of sins. He was unwilling to leave **YOU** in **YOUR** lost condition. He truly wanted a true friendship with **YOU**. Before Creation, God desired to share His heart and life with **YOU**. He made **YOU**, for this relationship, and He did what only He could do to reconcile **YOU** to Him. God has granted **YOU** free will to love Him. To follow Him. To surrender to Him.

It would be terrible if **OUR** concept of Him was one of dread and fear. While He is greatly to be feared (Psalm 89:7), He is also greatly to be praised (Psalm 96:4). Let **US** treat Him with the respect He richly deserves by loving Him more each day. Brethren, "complete love drives out fear" (1 John 4:18). Therefore, let **US** no longer live in fear by completely trusting in His love, grace, and mercy. The apostle Peter provides **US** with a great suggestion: "Therefore gird up the loins of **YOUR** mind, be sober, and rest **YOUR** hope fully upon the grace that is to be brought to **YOU** at the revelation of Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 1:13).

His desire for **US** is to relish in His grace. Think of His grace as **YOUR** own personal oasis in the middle of hot, dry desert. Picture the shade found there, and picture swimming in the cool refreshing water of that oasis. In like manner, **OUR** God desires that **WE** figuratively swim in His grace. His grace is **OUR** respite, **OUR** escape, and **OUR** safe haven of rest. May **WE** all enjoy His blessing of grace with joy and boldness, because like Abraham, **WE** are all friends of God: "Do YOU not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Whoever therefore wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God. (James 4:4).

In the Old Testament, the priestly blessing upon Israel said, "The Lord bless YOU and keep YOU; the Lord make his face to shine upon YOU and be gracious to YOU; the Lord lift up his countenance upon YOU and give YOU peace" (Num. 6:24–26). If WE can see God's intent toward US as being one of friendship rather than enmity, then OUR obedience to Him becomes OUR joy. John writes: "That which WE have seen and heard WE proclaim also to YOU, so that YOU too may have fellowship with US; and indeed, OUR fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ. And WE are writing these things so that OUR joy may be complete" (1 John 1:3,4). Therefore, this week, remember God's loving desire for YOU, individually, and US as His church: "And I will walk among you and will be your God, and you shall be my people" (Lev. 26:12). DP
