

# "THANKFUL" Doug Post

"In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thess. 5:18).

We happen to live in a country where, once a year in the fall, a day of "thanksgiving" is observed. It is appropriate for us to have such a day to remind ourselves of how blessed we are. No nation has ever prospered as we have. And since we tend to forget our blessings, taking them for granted, it is helpful to set aside a day to remember to be thankful.

Without a doubt, the greatest blessing God ever gave us was the gift of His Son. Lest we forget to be grateful, God has given us the Lord's Supper. May we meditate on God's grace in the giving of so many good things. May we be determined, more than ever, to give ourselves back to God in grateful obedience and service. Let's demonstrate we mean what we say when we offer thanks, such that outsiders may look at us and be moved to say, "Now there is a thankful group of people!"
