

THE FIRST DAY OF THE WEEK – SUNDAY Doug Post

Some of us remember when "Blue Laws" (or Sunday Laws) were in effect – when all, or most, businesses were closed on Sundays, including restaurants and stores of all kinds. This automatically made Sunday, the first day of the week, a special day. However, rightly or wrongly, "Sunday Laws" are now a "thing of the past."

Those of us who have long attended the services of the Lord's church on the first day of the week are witnessing the same kind of thing when it comes to Sunday worship. It seems we have gotten to the point where Sunday is no longer anything special to us. If so, we urgently need to do whatever is necessary to regain a sense of just how great a day the Lord's Day is.

The first day of the week is the day God set aside for us to worship and to remember Jesus and His death on the cross (1 Cor.11:23-26). It is the day set aside for Christians to assemble together to exhort, encourage, and edify one another (Heb.10:24-25). It is a day set aside to feast upon the love and grace of God, acknowledging all the spiritual blessings we enjoy in Christ. Quite simply, Sunday is a day of collective thanksgiving and our opportunity to worship and serve God, together, in one place, rejoicing in all the spiritual blessings we have in Christ.

At the very center of all these good things is the Lord Himself. If we love Him, His day (Sunday) ought to be the day we look forward to most of all. John wrote, "For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome" (1 Jn. 5:3). The fact we are commanded to worship on the Lord's Day does not mean it has to be a dreary duty. If we love the One who commanded us to remember Him, the day on which we do that will be our pleasure.

It would be profitable for us all to spend some time thinking about how we can — particularly in our families — make Sunday what it ought to be for us. What can we do to get out of the ruts we have gotten into? What can we do to make Sunday our favorite day of the week?

And consider this: how can we better prepare for the Lord's Day? What activities in our homes would make it more a day of remembrance about the Lord? How can we convey to our children and grandchildren the specialness of this day? What can we do to ensure that their childhood memories of Sunday involve more than the NFL and the NBA? What are some things we can do that will be conducive to growth in our understanding and observance of the Lord's Day?

This week, may we consider the fact that the first day of the week is a day to remember our Lord, making it His day, not ours.
