

THE GOSPEL PLAN OF SALVATION

Hear - Romans 10:17 Believe - John 8:24 Repent - Acts 17:30 Confess - Romans 10:10 Be Baptized - Acts 22:16 Saved - in Christ (Galatians 3:27)



Each Sunday when we partake of the Lord's Supper, we endeavor to recall and memorialize Jesus' suffering and sacrifice on the cross as we have been commanded. (Mt 26:26-29; Mk 14:22-25; Lk 22:17-20; 1 Cor. 11:23-26) Let us never forget nor diminish the slaps, punches, the beating with the rod on his thorn laden head, the scourging, the exertion and pain of carrying the cross on his mutilated back and shoulders, the pain of collapsing under the cross's weight onto a rough road, and ,of course, the agony of being nailed to and hung on the cross.

One aspect of his suffering that is often overlooked is the mental and emotional stress our Savior endured. Being both God and man, Jesus left all the wonders of Heaven and took on our limited form. (Jn.1:1-4,14) That separation and the subsequent limitation I do not think we can begin to understand. Most of us have experienced longing/missing a person or a place and or being physically hobbled. How could any of that compare to the loss of the glories of heaven and being restricted to the physical world he created?

What stress and suffering did he endure living with the full knowledge of when and how he would suffer and die. (Is. 53; Ps. 22:1-18; Mk. 8:31; 9:31; 10:32-34) What internal torment did he endure in restraining himself, knowing at any time he could just destroy the world and be free of the burden? Mt.26:53

³⁹ Coming out, He went to the Mount of Olives, as He was accustomed, and His disciples also followed Him. ⁴⁰ When He came to the place, He said to them, "Pray that you may not enter into temptation." ⁴¹ And He was withdrawn from them about a stone's throw, and He knelt down and prayed, ⁴² saying, "Father, if it is Your will, take this cup away from Me; nevertheless not My will, but Yours, be done." ⁴³ [a] Then an angel appeared to Him from heaven, strengthening Him. ⁴⁴ And being in agony, He prayed more earnestly. Then His sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground. (Luke 22: 39-44) NKJV

Hematidrosis is a rare medical condition where when a person is under such extreme physical and or mental stress, capillaries around their sweat glands will burst allowing blood to be excreted like sweat. The dread of what he knew was coming had peaked and the blood that would save the world started flowing. He who knew no sin (2 Cor. 5:21) would soon take on and become our sin.

Some day on high, all the facets and the full magnitude of Christ's suffering may be known to us. Until then, I hope we all can show, by the life we lead, how much his sacrifice means to us.
