

REMEMBER HOW MUCH YOU'VE BEEN FORGIVEN Doug Post

When Jesus was invited to a Pharisee's house, a woman in the city who had a reputation as a sinner heard He was there. She came in and, in an act of humility, washed His feet with her tears and anointed them with perfume (Luke 7:36-38).

When His host saw it, he thought Jesus must not know what type of person she was, otherwise He would not have allowed this. Jesus responded by telling a parable of two debtors – "one owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty" (Luke 7:41).

Both were forgiven by the moneylender when they could not repay (Luke 7:42). Jesus asked, "So which of them will love him more?" (Luke 7:42). His host correctly answered, "I suppose the one whom he forgave more" (Luke 7:43).

Jesus then applied the principle of the parable to the woman. She recognized her sinfulness and humbled herself before Jesus. The Pharisee did not offer any such service. Jesus said, "For this reason I say to you, her sins, which are many, have been forgiven, for she loved much; but he who is forgiven little, loves little" (Luke 7:47).

All of us have sinned and are in need of Christ's forgiveness. However, if we forget how hopelessly lost we were, it becomes easy to take our forgiveness for granted. When we remember this, it will not feel like a burden when we humbly submit to Christ, and serve Him.

So remember how much you've been forgiven. One sin is enough to separate us from God, but we have done that many times over. We were without hope before Christ came and died for our sins. Let's show gratitude to Him through humble service.
